

1959-60 JEWRY DUTY ATTRACTS LARGE RESPONSE Plans in Formulation for 1960-61

One of the most gratifying features of this past year of activities has been the unprecedented response to the Jewry Duty Program. Close to one hundred members of our congregational family have participated in the program this year.

What Is Jewry Duty?

The Jewry Duty program is a simple one. Each member of the congregation is asked to attend morning services for one week between the months of October and June. By accepting this religious "summons," the member not only has the mitzvah of coming to daily services, he also helps to maintain the daily minyan, an activity which constitutes the core of our religious program.

How Does It Work?

Each year, all members receive a letter from the president of the congregation requesting their participation. A particular week is assigned to each member and a return card is provided for his convenience. Provision is also made for a change of week in the event that the date assigned is not convenient.
