THIRTY ONE ENROLLED IN SABBATH CLASS

The class in Ethics of the Fathers has completed its fourth session of regular Saturday afternoon discussions in the synagogue library. At present there are thirty one regular students enrolled in the class.

The synagogue library seems too small to contain the overflow group. Last week, the late arrivals could not even find seats unoccupied. Arrangements have been made to accommodate the increasing numbers which attend each week.

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein explains one or two selections during the course of the period, which begins fifty minutes before Mincha. He cites the classical and modern commentaries which probe the depths of the aphorisms in the text. The discussion usually ranges far and wide, limited only by the interest of the students and the time available.

If you have not as yet attended this class, why not begin this week. The passage to be studied at the next session deals with the fruits of Torah study and commitment to Judaism. The depth analysis of this topic will result in some surprising conclusions.

The class is conducted in English and all men and women are welcome. It will begin this week at 7:10 P.M.
