YOUNG ADULTS CONCLUDE FIRST SEASON WITH COCKTAIL PARTY

BLOC VOTING DISCUSSED AT MEN'S CLUB ANNUAL MEETING

Elgin Shulsky, who delivered the annual report, welcomed the new members and wished them a long and happy association with the Club.

A Comprehensive View of Bloc Voting

Dr. Marshall Sklare delivered an extremely erudite address on bloc voting by religious and ethnic groups. He cited the fact that the pre-eminent factor in American politics has been economic class voting, while religious and ethnic voting has been a secondary factor.

Dr. Sklare distinguished between three levels of bloc voting. The primitive level is a reaction to a candidate who will directly support the individual in an ethnic group in the form of patronage, tax relief, or similar assistance. A more subtle type is voting for a candidate who will support the obvious interests of the group, as in the case of an Irishman voting for a candidate who favors Irish reunification. The most sophisticated example is voting for a nominee who cherishes the ideals of a particular group as in the case of Jews who vote for one who supports aid to education.

Our lecturer explained that religious bloc voting is frowned upon for several reasons. Firstly, the majority is against it. Secondly, the democratic ideal is to vote for the "best man."

Thirdly, America stands for the separation of church and state.

Dr. Sklare concluded by asserting that, in many respects, bloc voting is very American. It is usually opposed when the "other fellow" is doing it. In reality, it represents the orderly registering of the views of an individual via the ballot box rather than through riots. As such, it is, when practiced with reasonable restraint, an exemplary medium of democratic expression.
