FAST OF "SHIVA ASAR B'TAMMUZ"

The 17th day of Tammuz occurs this year on Tuesday, July 12th. Special services will be held during the morning and evening services on that day.

Shiva Asar B'Tammuz begins a three week period of mourning which culminates with the Fast of Tisha B'Av. During this period we remember the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem centuries ago.

On Shiva Asar B'Tammuz the wall of Jerusalem was first breached by the Babylonian soldiers in the year 586 B.C.E. Street fighting ensued for three weeks until Tisha B'Av, the day on which the Temple was burned to the ground.

THE WEEKLY PORTION

Beginning with this issue, we will publish information on the coming week's portion for the benefit of our readers. The object of this series is to acquaint our readers with the contents of the portion from the Torah which will be read in the synagogue on the Sabbath.

Balak — Saturday, July 9th

In this portion, Balak, King of Moab, asks the non-Jewish prophet Bileam to call down God's curses upon the Jewish people. Bileam finds himself unable to do so and instead invokes God's blessings. One of the most famous quotes from the Bible is found in this portion: "How goodly are thy tents, O Jacob, thy tabernacles, O Israel."

The portion closes with a brief account of the zealous act of Pinhas in dealing with one who desecrated God's name.

Pinhas — Saturday, July 16th

In this portion, there is a detailed enumeration of the daily, Sabbath, and holiday sacrifices which were brought in olden times. Many of the verses will sound familiar because of the fact that they are quoted extensively in the "Amidah" for the Sabbath and festivals.
