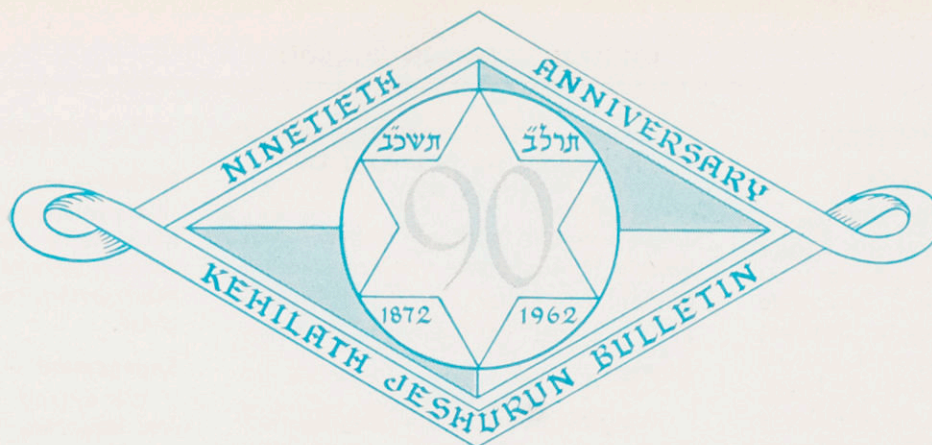

DR. SAMUEL BELKIN PRESENT AT AMBASSADOR BRUNCH LAST SUNDAY

A brunch was held last Sunday morning, in the social hall of the synagogue at which the more than forty Ambassadors from Kehilath Jeshurun to Yeshiva University were honored. Several of them received their medallions which are symbolic of the support which they are rendering to this unique educational enterprise. An Ambassador is one who gives one thousand dollars or more to Yeshiva during a calendar year.

A surprise guest at this brunch was the esteemed President of Yeshiva University and a former Trustee of our Congregation, Dr. Samuel Belkin. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein spoke about the University and about its distinguished President. Dr. Belkin, although not scheduled to speak, replied to the Rabbi's remarks with beautiful sentiments which described how he felt returning to a congregation which to him has always represented home.

Our own President, Max J. Etra, who is of course the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Yeshiva University, presided and announced the results of the generosity which Kehilath Jeshurun members have shown and continue to show toward Yeshiva University.

THE WEEKLY PORTION**SHABBAT HACHODESH****"This Month is for you"**

"This month is for you the beginning of months; it is the first for you of the months of the year." This verse opens the special reading for Shabbat haChodesh. It gives a special ring of importance to the month of Nisan which is upon us and to the season of Passover which it heralds.

The expression "for you," indicates that this month — and time in general — belongs to us. It is ours to use or to waste, to utilize efficiently and effectively or to squander without purpose and wastefully.

The gift of time to man has little meaning if man is not free. The slave's time belongs to his master, whether that master is a human owner of human chattel; a psychological compulsion which drives man to undesirable behavior; poverty and squalor which renders man a slave to his environment; or fear and trembling which paralyzes man's muscle and will.

That is why our portion this week contains the message of Passover — the proclamation that man is born free and may not be reduced to a slave status of any description whatsoever.

The free use of time also requires a guarantee of Divine Providence. If a world functions mechanically, if man is the helpless victim of nature, if human beings are given license to oppress their fellowmen without restraint, then freedom, if it exists at all, may be short lived.

The promise of Passover is that there is a God who cares. He will intervene in the historical arena to free the slaves in Egypt, in Rome, or in the South. If need be, He will prevent man from obliterating civilization through atomic war. He will not allow man to stand helpless at a Red Sea or to cringe before a "red menace."

His promise is that time is the slave of man and that man may not be enslaved to time — or to the time in which he lives. H. L.

PASSOVER IS JUST AROUND THE CORNER

Beginning with this week and continuing until Passover, the Bulletin will carry a column which will offer guidance and suggestions relative to the preparations for the Festival of Passover.

"Caveat Emptor"

A phrase which is of particular importance to Jewish housewives at this season of the year, is "Caveat Emptor" — let the buyer beware. During the next few weeks, the store will be filled with products bearing the inscription "Kosher for Passover." Food sections in magazines and newspapers will draw people's attention to a myriad of manufactured foods which are certified as proper for Passover use.

It is unfortunate that an inscription on a label is no guarantee of the fitness of the products for Passover. While many foods are processed under strict rabbinical supervision, there are more than a few unscrupulous people who take advantage of the natural innocence of the buyer.

Our Suggestion

Here, therefore, is our suggestion. Wherever possible, one should purchase products made by the reputable Matzoh firms. They have a complete line of Passover goods and the reputation of these firms is completely trustworthy.

In addition, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America

certifies a large variety of foods as "Kosher for Passover." In order to be sure that the Union is responsible for endorsing the product, one should look for the  on the label. A booklet listing the products supervised by the U.O.J.C.A. has already been mailed to all members. Further copies are available upon request.

Products which are under the supervision of individual rabbis, should always be considered with great caution. The product should be purchased only if one is certain of the reputation of the supervising rabbi. In the event of doubt, the synagogue office is prepared to give you information on the reliability of individual products.

Class for Passover

The Sabbath afternoon class on the laws of Passover will be held every Saturday until the holiday. The class this week will begin at 5:10. The subject of the class will be, "Making the Home Kosher for Passover."

Sale of Chometz

In accordance with Jewish Law, all chometz must be disposed of before Passover, and should not remain in one's possession during the festival. Chometz which cannot be disposed of may be sold in accordance with traditional practice.

For those who cannot attend to this matter in person, there is a form provided on this page which authorizes Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein to sell your chometz. This form should be returned to the synagogue within the next few days.

I, hereby authorize Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein to dispose of all chometz which may be in my possession wherever it may be; at home, place of business, or elsewhere in accordance with the requirements and provisions of Jewish Law.

PASSOVER RELIEF

Time Is of the Essence

The first paragraph in the Laws of Passover as they appear in the Shulchan Aruch (Code of Jewish Law) reads in part as follows: "It is customary to purchase wheat and to distribute it to the poor for Passover; and all who have lived in the city for at least twelve months are obligated to support this project."

The practice of providing for the poor for Passover takes precedence over all of the intricate laws pertaining to the festival. This is as it should be. The observance of the seder and the care to dispose of chometz are hollow gestures if they do not stimulate us to a meaningful concern for the welfare of those who are in need.

The response to our Passover Relief Appeal has been most gratifying. As of the publication date of the Bulletin over 140 persons have contributed a total exceeding \$2,000 to this Appeal. There are many, however, who have not as yet made their contribution. We urge them to do so without delay. The funds are needed in advance of the holiday in order to be of greatest benefit to the recipients.

In next week's Bulletin we will publish a list of all the donors.

CONGREGATIONAL SEDARIM TO BE CONDUCTED

Our members have already received mail concerning the Passover Sedarim, which will be held at our synagogue.

As in past years, reservations for the sedarim will be accepted for members of the congregation and for their immediate families only. This ruling must be adhered to, in order that the sedarim may continue to have the intimate family atmosphere of former years. Reservations will be accepted for both nights only.

Those who have attended the sedarim in the past, know of the inspiring and beautiful services that are held. If you plan to attend the sedarim, please reserve immediately. Reservations will not be accepted after April 1st. The charge per person for both nights is \$30.00.

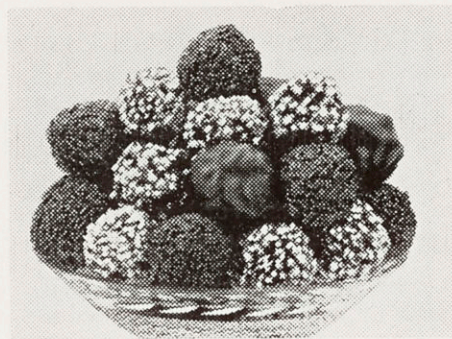
