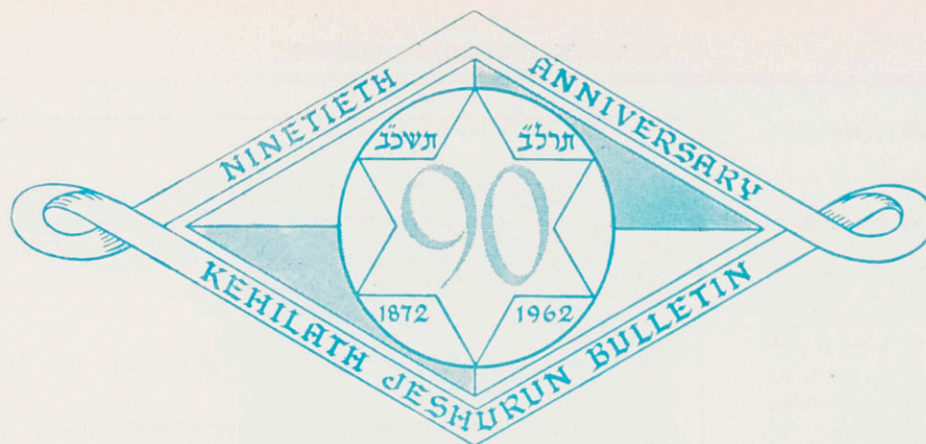

BEN-ZVI MEMORIAL HELD AT KEHILATH JESHURUN

Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun served as the host to a memorial program in honor of the late and lamented Izhak Ben-Zvi, second President of the State of Israel. The program which was held at noon last Tuesday, was sponsored jointly by the Israel Consulate and the New York Board of Rabbis.

Forty Nations Represented

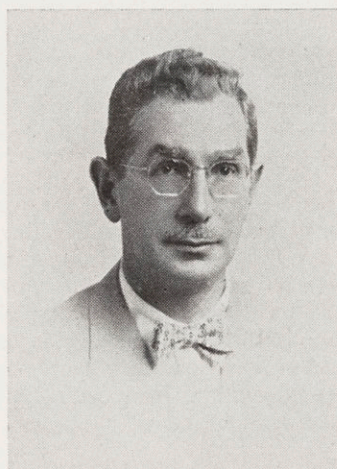
The entire experience was an unforgettable one for many members of our congregation and for the high school students of Ramaz who were present for the program. More than forty nations of the world were represented by members of their United Nations delegations. The list of dignitaries were headed by the Honorable Adlai E. Stevenson, United States Ambassador to the United Nations. Many of the African nations which have been befriended by Israel and in which the late President took a personal interest, were also represented by their U.N. delegates.

The program was a brief, but moving one. The Honorable Michael Comay, head of Israel's delegation to the United Nations, spoke briefly about the character and personality of Ben-Zvi. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein delivered a sensitive and inspiring analysis of the way in which the second President of Israel typified the spirit of Israel and the Jewish people, by his bearing, by his accomplishments and by his life's work.

Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun was proud to serve as the host congregation to this unforgettable display of warmth and admiration for an heroic figure of the world Jewish community and a leading participant in the drama which is the rebirth of the Jewish people in its national homeland.

The President of the Men's Club William Lebowitz has, over the past few years come up through the ranks of the Club's offices. He has served both as Treasurer and as Vice President. He was the Chairman of the

Father and Son Minyan Committee, and the spearhead of that activity, for some 8 years. During the past season he was the Chairman of the most successful Theatre Party ever conducted by the Men's Club — financially speaking.

The Vice President, Abraham R. Kirshon, served during the past year as Treasurer of the Club and is one of the organizers of the National Association of Men's Clubs affiliated with Yeshiva University. He has been the Chairman of the Metropolitan Region of that organization for several years.

The Treasurer, Dr. Jack Lieberman, served last year as Comptroller and has brought new life and spirit into the programming of the Men's Club. He, too, has given of his time and leadership to the National Association of Men's Clubs.

As Secretary, Ira F. Weisman, the Chairman of the Nominating Committee, nominated, and the club elected, Nico deGraaf, a young man who has served on the Executive Board of the Club and who has distinguished himself as Co-Chairman of the Board of Ushers of the congregation.

Martin Markson, the President of the Club for the past two years joins the other past Presidents as an elder statesman, though at a relatively young age. We are confident that the new administration will build upon the fine record of the past and, with new vigor, will apply itself to the attainment of even greater successes in the future.

"NOT FEAR BUT REVERENCE"

THE WEEKLY PORTION**AHARE-KEDOSHIM****A portion Which Speaks for Itself**

This week's portion presents us with the Code of Holiness. In clear terms it defines the holy man as one whose actions are a response to God's will and whose relationship with man, as well as with God, is an exemplary one. This definition is forthcoming from the following excerpts. The words in parentheses are our own.

"... Be holy for I the Lord your God am holy. Every man should revere his mother and father and preserve my sabbaths. (Why?) I am the Lord your God. Do not turn to the idols and do not create molten idols. (Why?) I am the Lord your God.

"And when you reap the harvest do not reap fully the corner of your field and do not gather all the gleanings of your harvest... leave them for the poor and the stranger. (Why?) I am the Lord your God.

"Do not steal... and do not lie to one another... do not exploit your neighbor... and do not withhold payment from the laborer until the morrow. Do not curse the deaf and do not place a stumbling block before the blind. (Why?) For you must fear your God, I am the Lord.

"Do not hate your brother in your heart... do not be vengeful and do not bear a grudge against a member of your people. Love thy neighbor as thyself. (Why?) I am the Lord."

ETHICS OF THE FATHERS CLASS RESUMES THIS WEEK

The class in Ethics of the Fathers will begin its sessions for the season this Saturday afternoon at 6:45 o'clock and will be conducted in English by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein.

The class is scheduled to run for six weeks and will begin with the middle of the sixth chapter with a view toward completing that chapter by the end of the six week period.

This year's session will mark the conclusion of one cycle of study of this basic book of Jewish ethics. During each of the preceding five years we covered at least one chapter of this Tractate of the Talmud. At the conclusion of this year's session we will have a "siyum" (completion ceremony) for the entire work. The class, which will be held in the synagogue library, is open to all — men and women, young and old — whether or not they have a reading knowledge of Hebrew. The insights to be gained from this book are plentiful and the understanding of Jewish ethics which is forthcoming from this work is both penetrating and inspiring.

A cordial invitation is extended to all to attend this week's session at 6:45 P.M. and the sessions which will follow it.

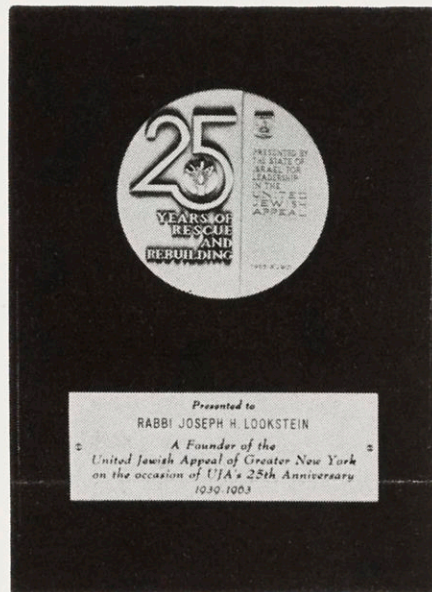
