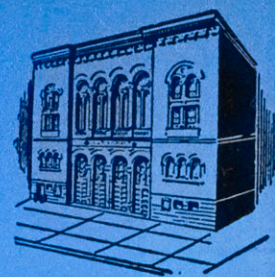

TORAH HONORS FOR JACOB KLEIN, LEON SIGALL AND DAVID ROSEN



Jacob A. Klein

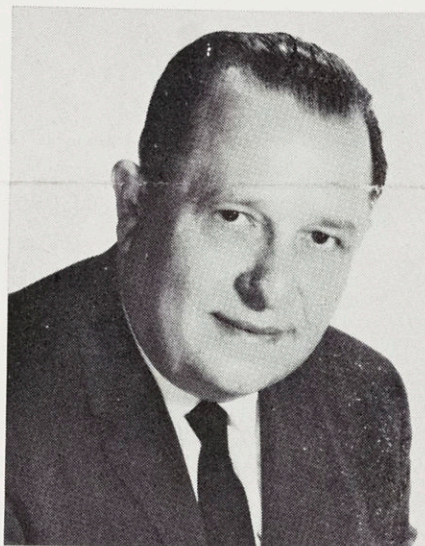
The highest honors of the year were awarded to three outstanding members of Kehilath Jeshurun. Mr. Jacob E. Klein was designated as "Chasan Torah". Mr. Leon Sigall was appointed "Chasan Bereshith" and Mr. E. David Rosen will be "Chasan Maftir".

Mr. Jacob A. Klein is part of our congregational family only a short time. He has, however, been a faithful worshipper in our midst for a good many years. Sabbath after Sabbath he walks from his home on the West Side to be with us.

He was a pioneer in the ladies' clothing manufacturing business which he entered in 1915. He is one of the foremost and most respected leaders in that industry.

His philanthropies include many causes. Klein Hall at Yeshiva University was made possible through his generosity as a memorial to his sainted wife. He is a life-long supporter of the Home and Hospital of the Daughters of Jacob. He is an "Ambassador" of Yeshiva University and a "Founder" of Bar-Ilan University in Israel.

In the United Jewish Appeal he is respected for his unfailing cooperation, and every great institution here and in

Israel has been the beneficiary of his substance.

He is the head of a wonderful household. His sons and daughters virtually adore him, as do his nine grandchildren and his two great-grandchildren.

As a man of piety, kindness and generosity he is the most deserving recipient of the honor of "Chasan Torah".

The "Chasan Bereshith", Mr. Leon Sigall, hails from Leipzig where he studied in the Realschule under Dr. Ehpraim Carlebach and in the School of Commerce in Leipzig. As a young man, he was active in the Zionist organizations of his city, notably the "Bar-Kochba", until forced to leave the country with the advent of Nazism.

His wife, whose maiden name was Hertha Dubiner, is a learned lady. After receiving a splendid Jewish education, she attended Leipzig University, specializing in medical and bio-chemical studies.

Husband and wife share all their benevolences in common, through the Leon and Hertha Sigall Foundation from which support is given to every important cause.

The two children of the Sigalls re-

flect the teaching of their parents and the atmosphere of the home in which they were reared. The daughter Judy is married to Herbert K. Schipper, and their older child is already enrolled in a Jewish day-school in Lawrence, L. I. The son Michael is one of the exemplary graduates of Ramaz High School and is presently a sophomore in City College. Michael's proudest memory is undoubtedly the fact that he celebrated his Bar Mitzvah with his family in Israel.

A family so committed to Jewish and general learning, is deserving that its head should be selected for the honor of "Chasan Bereshith".

E. David Rosen, the "Chasan Maftir", was virtually born and brought up at Kehilath Jeshurun. He became Bar Mitzvah at Kehilath Jeshurun — the first Bar Mitzvah to be celebrated in the newly remodelled Synagogue in 1948. He graduated from Yale University in 1957. His proud parents, Samuel and Eleanore Rosen, provided for him, as they did for all their children, a fine Jewish education. It was always an impressive sight to see the father walk into our House of God, followed by his three sons.

RABBI ISAAC N. TRAININ TO ADDRESS OPENING MEETING OF MEN'S CLUB SEASON

On Tuesday night, October 29th, at 8:30, the Men's Club of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun will hold its opening meeting of the year in the social hall of the Synagogue House. The meeting will be opened to members and non-members, men and women.

The highlight of the meeting will be a lecture to be given by Rabbi Isaac N. Trainin, the Director of the Department of Religious Affairs of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies. Rabbi Trainin will discuss the subject "What Price Conformity" — An In-

quiry into the Social Ills of American Jewry.

In recent months and years a variety of social ills which were not evident in the Jewish community before have come upon the scene. The divorce and separation rate among Jewish married couples is rapidly approaching that of the general population. For the first time we now have a problem of drug addiction among Jews, especially among juveniles. There is a rise in promiscuity among young Jewish men and women. In a recent open letter, which appeared in the New York Board of Rabbis' Monthly Bulletin, a prominent Jewish historian called attention to the increased incidents of crime among Jewish youth. For some years now the rising tide of inter-marriage has been a cause of considerable distress in the Jewish community.

Rabbi Trainin, through his office in Federation, is intimately acquainted with all of these problems. Hardly a day goes by without several cases being brought to his attention which touch on these social ills. He will have much to cite from his own personal work in this area.

A cordial invitation is extended to all to attend this first open meeting of the season of the Men's Club. A light collation will follow the lecture.

HAKAFOTH AT KEHILATH JESHURUN

On Thursday night, October 10, we will begin the celebration of the completion of the Torah - Simchath Torah. From year to year, the congregation which assembles in the evening and in the morning grows in numbers, increases in enjoyment, and expands in merry-making. Chassidic spirit is a rare phenomenon in Yorkville but on Simchath Torah it is experienced in full in our synagogue.

The singing and the dancing contribute to the gaiety. The marching of Junior Marshalls before each Torah procession compounds the joy. The impromptu choir of young people, which supports the Cantor as he incorporates a medley of congregational melodies into the prayers, furthers the atmosphere of merriment. It is a wonderful evening and day for the whole family, with the children serving as the guests of honor.

In order to enable the evening services to run smoothly we should like to call your attention to the following matters:

1. Come with your families but please refrain from bringing children under 4 years of age to the synagogue. Experience has shown that their limited attention span works a hardship upon the children themselves and upon the adults who would like to enjoy the proceedings.
2. Please bring the children on Thursday to the synagogue chapel on time - no later than 5:30. Please also be good enough not to bring them before 5:20 because a long wait will only make them restless.
3. Paraphrasing a well known commercial statement, "Don't make a fuss; leave their care to us." Competent leaders will be in charge of the children and are equipped to deal with all their needs.

After the benediction, you may meet your children in the main synagogue lobby (downstairs) where they will receive the special sweets which constitute so vital a part of the Simchath Torah tradition.

Remember the schedule: Mincha at 5:30 - children not before 5:20 and not after 5:30. Come and participate in the festivities.

YOUNG MARRIEDS TO OPEN SEASON AT RABBI'S HOME SATURDAY NIGHT, OCTOBER 19th

Dr. Charles Cohen, the new Chairman of the Young Marrieds Group of the congregation, has announced that the 1963-64 season of the group will begin on Saturday night, October 19th. On that date, the group will hold a meeting at the home of Rabbi and Mrs. Haskel Lookstein, 1235 Park Avenue. The meeting is called for 8:30 o'clock.

The highlight of the meeting will be a discussion led by J. Harrison Golden on the problems confronting the country in the fight for integration. Mr. Golden will be remembered as the young man who spoke on this subject before a Men's Club Meeting last year and who predicted at that time that the achievement of even partial integration in the South would come only after violence and bloodshed. These words were spoken in March. The first shots in this war were fired in May.

Mr. Golden lived in the South for almost two years, and served as a litigating attorney for the Civil Rights Division of the Justice Department. He shared a room on the University of Mississippi Campus with James Meredith for some time and grew to understand the bitterness which exists in the South on the question of integration.

He is now back in New York as a practicing Attorney and has had an opportunity to compare the views of "enlightened Northerners" on this heated subject. The members of our Young Marrieds Group will, no doubt, gain much from his insights and analysis.
