YOUNG MARRIEDS HEAR LECTURE ON JEWISH NOVELISTS IN AMERICA

The Young Marrieds Group of the congregation held a meeting last Saturday night in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Noam Shudofsky. The highlight of the meeting was a discussion of Jewish novelists in America. The discussion was led by Mr. Benjamin Nelson, instructor in the Drama and Comparative Literature at Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Mr. Nelson, who has published one work on Tennessee Williams and is concluding another work on the plays of Arthur Miller, as his doctoral dissertation, spoke to a hushed audience for over an hour. Many of the members of the group felt as if they were back in college, listening to the scintillating and perceptive analysis of literature which is the trademark of the expert.

Mr. Nelson ranged through the entire field of American Jewish novelists, which, strangely enough, embraces just about the entire field of novelists in America — at least those who are younger than John Steinbeck. He indicated that the Jewish novelists have not, in his opinion, achieved a breakthrough of significant proportions in writing novels which reflect the insights and traditions of our Jewish heritage.

If such a breakthrough is about to be achieved, its herald may perhaps be Saul Bellow's most recent book, "Herzog", which in the opinion of Mr. Nelson begins to show the utilization of Jewish ethics, outlooks and values in the description of a literary personality.

The next meeting of the Group will be held on Sunday evening, February 7, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Bernstein. Our discussion leader for that evening will be Noam Shudofsky. Members are urged to return the card which was enclosed with their letter so that the necessary plans can be made.

Teenagers Discuss Russian Jewry

Once again Shachar, our Teenage Group, has been successful in introducing a unique programming technique. A fine proportion of boys were in attendance at the program on Sunday morning, December 20th. We hope that the future will bring a greater turnout of girls.

The activity was three-fold in character. Shacharith services were led by David Kahn, Alan Kalischer, and Steven Schacter. Breakfast and a discussion of future activities followed. The highlight of the morning was the showing of the film, "The Price of Silence". As a result of viewing this portrayal of the tragic plight of Russian Jewry, the group signed a petition which was presented by Robert Pik that very same afternoon at a meeting of the American Jewish Council on Soviet Jewry. This meeting included representatives from all national Jewish youth groups in the country. The petition reads:

To the Government of the U.S.S.R.

We are American Jewish Teenagers who have become aware of the condition of the Jews in the Soviet Union. The denial of basic human rights to those Jews, contrary to the Soviet Constitution, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and basic moral law, has greatly disturbed us. We, the 64 members of Shachar, the Teenage Group of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun, call upon the Soviet Government to end this wrong by:

1. Conducting a vigorous campaign to eradicate anti-Semitism.
2. Permitting free functioning of synagogues and yeshivah.
3. Providing proper facilities for the printing of needed religious books.
4. Making possible the production of religious articles.
5. Providing proper facilities for the propagation of Jewish culture.
6. Assuring equal application of all laws to all citizens.
7. Permitting necessary communications between Russian Jews and their co-religionists abroad.

We recognize that we are asking no more than the rights that are granted to other religious and national groups within the Soviet Union.

HEADLINES OF JEWISH INTEREST

Extending the Time Limit on War Crimes Prosecution

The French National Assembly approved recently by a unanimous vote a law holding that war crimes and crimes against humanity are not subject to any time limit for prosecution in France.

The bill, which is to become law probably early next year, will mean that former war criminals will not be able to enter French territory without risking arrest and prosecution by the French Government.

Seven members of the British Parliament issued an appeal to the West German Government to extend the time limit in that country for the prosecution of Nazi war criminals beyond next May 8. While the West German Cabinet indicated on November 11 that constitutional reasons made it impossible to extend the deadline, there have been recent hints that some way may be found to extend the deadline.



Einstein College Receives U.S. Grant of \$289,000.00

The Albert Einstein College of Medicine of Yeshiva University was announced by President Johnson as the recipient of \$289,000 from the United States Office of Economic Opportunity as part of the administration's Anti-Poverty Program. The grant is for the establishment of a network of "store front neighborhood aid centers" to be conducted in a depressed area of the Bronx by the Medical School.

The grant is part of the \$20,000,000 allocated for New York and vicinity under the Anti-Poverty Program. The project will be conducted by the College's Department of Psychiatry.

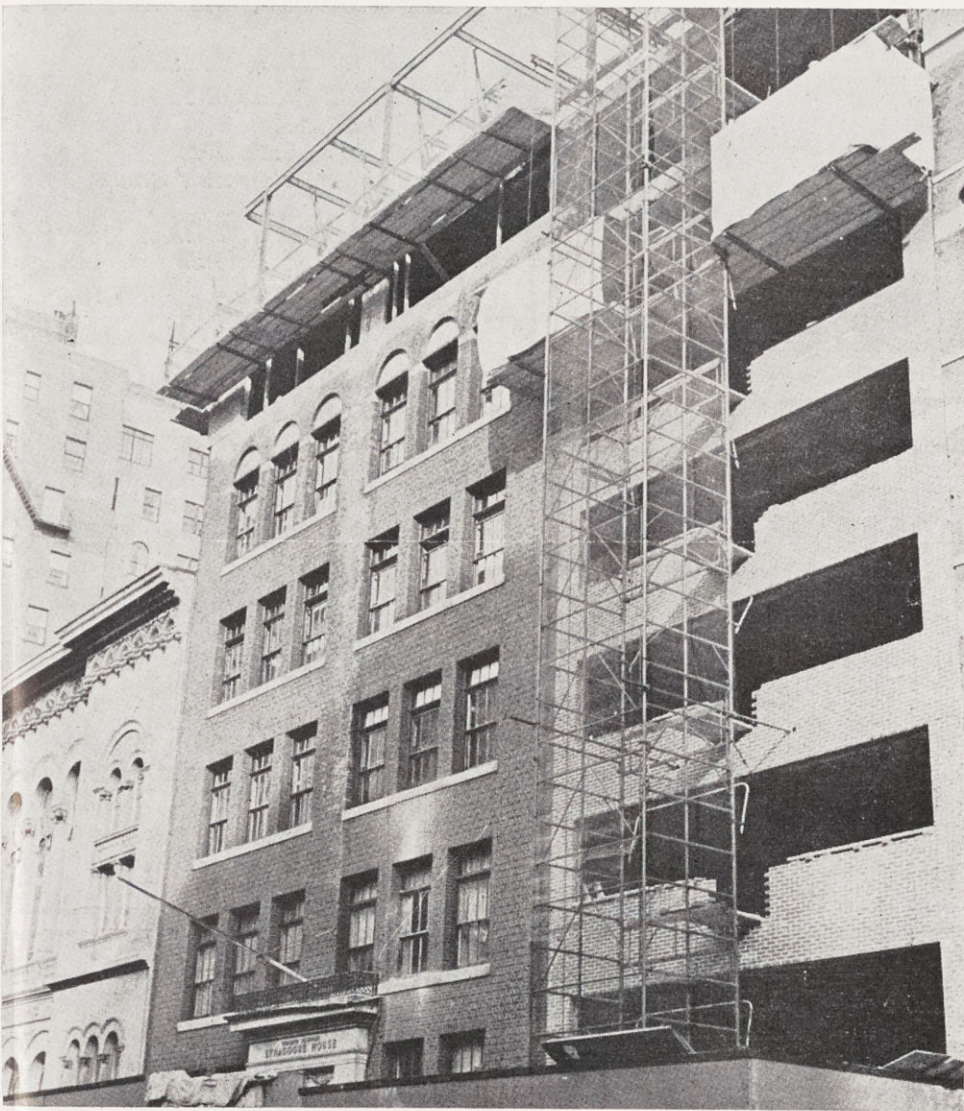
