YOUNG MARRIEDS HEAR HON. HAIM ZOHAR

Some 40 members of the Young Marrieds Group met at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Nat Shafer on Saturday night, March 20th for a regular meeting. The highlight of the evening was a talk by Hon. Haim Zohar, Consul of the State of Israel in New York City.

Consul Zohar discussed the religious problems which exist in the State of Israel. He indicated that on most political issues there is a broad range of agreement among Israelis. While individual political parties may express different points of view, there is an extensive consensus in Israel about most of the vital issues. Religion seems to be something of an exception to that rule.

Extremist segments of the observant and secular groups clash frequently. One extreme sees the need for Israel to become a theocracy, a state governed entirely by God's law without recourse to public approval. Another extreme sees Israel in purely secular — even atheistic — terms and would like the State to divorce itself entirely from any ties with Jewish tradition.

Our speaker indicated that Israel is not a theocracy by any means. There are, to be sure, a number of vital areas which are governed by halachah. The decision, however, to govern these areas in such a manner was made in accordance with parliamentary prac-

tice. The laws which declare matters of personal status to be governed by religious rule, the Sabbath day to be the official day of rest, and other such regulations, were passed by the Knesset of Israel. In this sense, these rules reflect the decisions of a democratic process.

The speaker highlighted some of the problems which religious Jewry, in particular, ought to try to solve. One such problem is the Israeli Rabbinate which, at the present time, does not have many members who are trained in general academic matters and who can speak the "language" of the modern Israeli. There is a need for the establishment of modern synagogues in Israel with affiliated youth groups and adult education programs which would make traditional Judaism meaningful and attractive to the present generation. There is also a need to render Jewish law applicable to modern situations as did the Chief Chaplain of the Israel Army, Rabbi Goren, in working out the complex problems of running an army with due regard to dietary laws and Sabbath observance.

Some of the thoughts expressed by the Consul were off the record. All of his remarks, however, were very much to the point. The Young Marrieds Group is grateful to him for his clarification of many important problems.

SHABBAT HACHODESH

"This Month is for you"

"This month is for you the beginning of months, it is the first for you of the months of the year." This verse opens the special reading for Shabbat haChodesh. It gives a special ring of importance to the month of Nisan which is upon us and to the season of Passover which it heralds.

The expression "for you," indicates that this month — and time in general — belongs to us. It is ours to use or to waste, to utilize efficiently and effectively or to squander without purpose and wastefully.

The gift of time to man has little meaning if man is not free. The slave's time belongs to his master, whether that master is a human owner of human chattel; a psychological compulsion which drives man to undesirable behavior; poverty and squalor which renders man a slave to his environment; or fear and trembling which paralyzes man's muscle and will.

That is why our portion this week contains the message of Passover — the proclamation that man is born free and may not be reduced to a slave status of any description whatsoever.

The free use of time also requires a guarantee of Divine Providence. If a world functions mechanically, if man is the helpless victim of nature, if human beings are given license to oppress their fellowmen without restraint, then freedom, if it exists at all, may be short lived.

The promise of Passover is that there is a God who cares. He will intervene in the historical arena to free the slaves in Egypt, in Rome, or in the South. If need be, He will prevent man from obliterating civilization through atomic war. He will not allow man to stand helpless at a Red Sea or to cringe, hopeless before a "red menace."

His promise is that time is the slave of man and that man may not be enslaved to time — or to the time in which he lives.

PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

There are several items regarding preparations for Passover which we would like to bring to your attention.

Sale of Chametz

In accordance with Jewish Law, all chametz must be disposed of before Passover, and should not remain in one's possession during the festival. Chametz which cannot be disposed of may be sold in accordance with traditional practice.

For those who cannot attend to this matter in person, there is a form provided on this page which authorizes Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein to sell your chametz. This form should be returned to the synagogue within the next few days.

Let the buyer beware

A phrase which is of particular importance to Jewish housewives at this season of the year, is "Caveat Emptor" — let the buyer beware. During the next few weeks, the store will be filled with products bearing the inscription "Kosher for Passover." Food sections in magazines and newspapers will draw people's attention to a myriad of manufactured foods which are certified as proper for Passover use.

It is unfortunate that an inscription on a label is no guarantee of the fitness of the products for Passover. While many foods are processed under strict rabbinical supervision, there are more than a few unscrupulous people who take advantage of the natural innocence of the buyer.

Our Suggestion

Here, therefore, is our suggestion. Whenever possible, one should purchase products made by the reputable Matzoh firms. They have a complete line of Passover goods and the

reputation of these firms is completely trustworthy.

In addition, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregation of America certifies a large variety of foods as "Kosher for Passover." In order to be sure that the Union is responsible for endorsing the product, one should look for the ©P on the label. A booklet listing the products supervised by the U.O.J.C.A. has already been mailed to all members. Further copies are available upon request.

Products which are under the supervision of individual rabbis, should always be considered with great caution. The product should be purchased only if one is certain of the reputation of the supervising rabbi. In the event of doubt, the synagogue office is prepared to give you information on the reliability of individual products.

RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN TO CONVENE CLASS THIS SATURDAY AT 5:00 P.M.

A special class dealing with the necessary preparations for Passover will be conducted by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, this Saturday afternoon at 5:00 in the library. He will discuss the methods of preparing household utensils and appliances for Passover and the practice of searching for Chametz. He will also present a list of certain necessary foods which are under reliable endorsement for the festival.
