A Sermon in Honor of Youth Sabbath**

A WORD ABOUT YOUTH SABBATH

This period of the year is one of semi-mourning because of the death of many of Rabbi Akiba's students in a plague some 1800 years ago. Traditionally, we also mourn for the annihilation suffered by Ashkenazic Jewry during this season of the year in the period of the Crusades. Besides the loss of physical life, we also lost some of the greatest centers of learning in Jewish history at that time.

One is struck by the contrast with our anticipated mood this coming Sabbath in the synagogue. We shall see scores of young men and women who are steeped in our heritage and who are plagued only by the question of how they can commit themselves fully to Judaism in a free and open society.

We shall be witness to the tangible results of the miraculous revival of Jewish scholarship on the soil of America. For the first time in generations, perhaps, we shall see young people who are more conscious of their Jewishness — and in many cases more learned about it — than are their elders.

On the Sabbath, all mourning ceases. On this particular Sabbath, all of us at Kehilath Jeshurun will have extra cause for celebration, pride and confidence.

RAMAZ AND SHACHAR STAR IN YOUTH SALUTE TO ISRAEL

At the Youth Salute to Israel held on Sunday, May 2nd, 110 Ramaz High School students — many of them members of our teenage group — played a leading and starring role. The program was a community-wide celebration of the 17th Anniversary of the State of Israel.

The students participated in the march on East 72nd Street, proudly displaying their Ramaz banner. They were doubly proud because our representation was the largest of any high school in the city. The photograph below shows some of our youngsters in the march.

One of the highlights of the formal program at the Central Park Mall was

the release of 17 white doves representing 17 years of Israel's striving for peace. These doves were released by 34 Ramaz students in an appropriate ceremony on stage.

We are particularly happy that about 75% of the eligible student body in Ramaz saw fit to participate in this significant demonstration of interest for the State of Israel. One quarter of the student body could not have been present, in any case, because they were taking their College Board exams at the time of the celebration.

Our congratulations to the congregation's Youth Director, Noam Shudofsky, for the way in which he coordinated the role of Ramaz and Shachar in this important activity.
