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MAX J. ETRA ELECTED TO 26TH CONSECUTIVE TERM AT ANNUAL MEETING; JOSEPH ROTH, ELGIN SHULSKY AND IRWIN SHAPIRO RE-ELECTED TO OFFICE

The Ninety-Third Annual Meeting of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun was held on Tuesday evening, May 11th. More than 300 members of the congregation were present to mark this official event in the life of the congregation.

Max J. Etra, President of the congregation, presided at the Annual Meeting. His name was presented by Hyman I. Bucher on behalf of the Nominations Committee for a twenty-sixth consecutive term as President. Mr. Etra was re-elected by acclamation. Joseph Roth, Elgin Shulsky and Irwin Shapiro were re-elected unanimously to new terms as Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary respectively.
