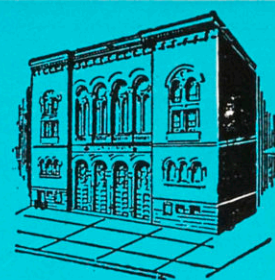

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FORTY-NINE SENIORS GRADUATED FROM RAMAZ HIGH SCHOOL

Another exemplary Senior Class in the best of traditions of Ramaz High School was graduated last Thursday evening at exercises held in the Y.M.-H.A. Among the 49 graduates are seven young members of our congregational family:

Continuing in the tradition of previous graduating classes, the Senior Class of 1965 has established for itself an enviable record in the competition for New York State Regents Scholarships. Of the 46 students who are residents of New York State and who were, therefore, eligible to take the examination, 31 have already won scholarships, or are alternates who are high on the list and who should be receiving word of their qualifying for scholarships within the next several weeks.

In addition to these honors, several students of the class have won further recognition in State and National competition for various awards. These include a group of semi-finalists in the National Merit competition, one semi-finalist for the National Honor Society Scholarship, one Bausch-Lomb Science Award and one Mayor's Citation for scholarship, among others.

BEHAALOTECHA

"The Most Modest of All"

Our portion for this week contains the famous statement about Moses: "and the man Moses was very modest, more than any man on the face of the earth." It is probably this verse that serves as the basis for the remark in the opening of the 6th chapter of the Ethics of the Fathers, that learning and practicing the Torah for its own sake endows a human personality with the quality of modesty.

On the surface there is something perplexing about the Biblical statement and the Talmudic conclusion. We might well understand that modesty is a necessary prerequisite for learning Torah and even for practicing it. One who is cocky enough to believe that he knows all the answers cannot learn anything, let alone Torah which affords guidance and instruction on how to conduct oneself in daily life.

Once a man has learned Torah, however, and once he has achieved prominence as a scholar, one might expect him to be anything but modest. Perched atop his intellectual roost, he is able to look down upon his less informed and more sparsely educated fellow man with condescension.

If we see a scholar behave in such a way from time to time, we have a right to assume that Moses, who studied from the greatest Teacher of all and who passed his oral and written examinations enveloped in a heavenly cloud and studying, as it were, face to face with the Almighty, that such a man would not be expected to retain the quality of modesty.

Apparently, however, our judgment is incorrect, for Moses is described as the most modest of men. This is as it should be, for when a man confronts God face to face, when he has learned the secrets of existence, and when he has comprehended the essence of God's ethical revelation, he cannot but be struck by his own insignificance.

This should be the reaction of the man who studies and practices Torah. The higher he goes, the more lowly should he consider himself. The highest of all is, consequently, "more modest than any man on the face of the earth."

PARK EAST RELIGIOUS SCHOOL CLOSING EXERCISES

A fine gathering assembled in the Social Hall of the congregation last Sunday for the closing exercises of the Park East Religious School. The gathering was treated to a program which was both inspiring and informative.

Our member, Mr. William B. Fischberg, who is a member of the Board of Directors of the school, presented greetings on behalf of the Board. He congratulated the students on their splendid achievement during the past year.

The highlight of the program was the presentation by the graduates and school players of a Cantata entitled, "Stand And Be Numbered" by Ben Aronin. The Cantata showed that man is not judged by numbers but by deeds. The audience sat in rapt attention as the students presented a well integrated program including Hebrew song and Biblical text. Mr. Stanley Sperber adapted and directed the Cantata.

Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein delivered the charge and awarded the diplomas to the graduating students. The graduates were reminded of the fact that they have reached the first rung in their Jewish educative process. They and their parents were told that, "He who initiates a mitzvah must obey the impulse to complete it." He spoke of the exceptional progress made by the school during the past two years under the leadership of Mr. Noam Shudofsky. He informed the gathering of the appointment of Mr. Shudofsky to the post of Administrator of the Ramaz School. At the same time it was announced Rabbi Jack Guttenberg has been appointed as Principal of the
