## **MORE THAN 100 MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN JEWRY DUTY**

It is now some 11 years since Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun first pioneered in the program which we know as "Jewry Duty." During that period, more and more members of the congregation have joined the ranks of those who support the Daily Minyan by their personal participation.

During the past year, 115 members of our congregational family obligated themselves to attend, at least, one full week of morning services. This is the highest figure in the history of this program and it indicates the increasing awareness on the part of our membership of the importance of the institution of daily worship.

As a result of this volunteer service, we are happy to say that our Daily Minyan continues to function on a sound basis. In addition, many members of our congregation have been introduced to the practice of regular daily worship as a result of their participation in this program.

We might add, that Orthodox synagogues throughout the country have taken this model program and have introduced it into their religious services with outstanding success. The Kehilath Jeshurun Jewrers, therefore, are performing a service for themselves, for our congregation and for the wider Traditional Jewish community in this land.

We hope that next year every member will feel it a personal obligation to join us in the support of this great "Mitzvah."
