**"I AM A STRANGER AND A RESIDENT..."
ABRAHAM PLEADS FOR CIVIL RIGHTS**

"Long on Words; Short on Deeds"

A casual reading of the account in this week's portion of the purchase by Abraham of a burial plot for Sarah, will reveal Ephron the Hittite as a man of magnanimity and generosity. A more analytical perusal will show him to be a man long on words but short on deeds.

Abraham begins by asking for a burial plot for which he is prepared to pay "the full price." The account continues as follows: And Ephron was seated among the people of Heth; and (he) answered Abraham within earshot of the people of Heth and of those who entered the gate of the city, saying . . . "The field I give to you and also the cave within it; in the presence of my people I give it to you to bury your dead."

And Abraham . . . answered Ephron within earshot of his landsmen, saying; "If you will only listen to me; I wish to give you the price of the field; take it from me . . ." And Ephron answered Abraham, saying: "Now hear this, my lord; The land is worth four hundred shekels of silver; what is this between us; now bury your dead."

And Abraham heard Ephron and he weighed the money before Ephron, even as he had offered before the people of Heth, four hundred silver shekels, in general currency.

The reader will note that Ephron's magnanimous gesture was offered "within earshot of the people of Heth." There were many witnesses to his generous words. The price which he set, however, was set in private, for the Bible does not mention the presence of listeners at that point. Abraham, on the other hand, never had any intention of burying his wife at the expense of someone else. Moreover, when he paid the price, c.o.d., he did it before the people of Heth. Ephron's character was exposed to all, a big man with promises, but a small man in deeds.

It is no wonder that the Talmud, noting the abbreviated spelling of Ephron's name in the text, concludes that something was missing from this charlatan for "he spoke freely but he acted abstemiously."
