# "This Is My God and I will Glorify Him"

In the Song of the Sea we read the words: "This is my God and I will glorify him." There are various methods commonly used to glorify God. Some do it through building magnificent sanctuaries for His worship. Others do it by carving statues and painting glorious canvasses in His honor. The Talmud presents two different methods for glorifying God.

The first method concerns ritual. It calls upon the Jew to beautify himself before God by constructing a beautiful sukkah, by purchasing a lovely lulav and by donning "tsitsith" of special quality. This accounts for the great pride which a Jewish family takes in its sukkah on the festival of Tabernacles. It explains the great care exercised in selecting a beautiful ethrog and lulav. It also explains the traditional importance ascribed to a fine Talith.

It is noteworthy that these mitzvoth are all personal ones which must be performed by each individual for himself, rather than by the community or a representative. By exercising special care in this performance we are personally glorifying God by the importance which we ascribe to the performance of His commands.

The glorification, however, is not restricted to ritual alone. It extends to the sphere of human relations. One sage in the Talmud asserts that the ultimate in glorification is emulation—a conclusion which has been borne out by modern studies in human psychology. "Just as He is gracious and merciful, so are we to be gracious and merciful," says the Talmud. Honor to the Creator is thus reflected in respect for his creation; homage to the Almighty is expressed by righteous behavior toward humanity.

The glorification of God, therefore, is not a matter of words or objects; it is rather a result of the action of subjects. The personal performance of God's will is the beginning of the glorification. The personification of his ethical qualities, as it were, is the culmination of it.

### KEHILATH JESHURUN TO HOST YESHIVA UNIVERSITY LECTURE ON MONDAY EVENING, FEBRUARY 20

The Community Service Division of Yeshiva University, in conjunction with Yeshiva's Rabbinic Alumni Association, is sponsoring a Colloquium for Synagogue Leaders during the months of January, February and March of 1967. Each month a special lecture will be delivered at three centers in the metropolitan area.

Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun has been chosen as the host congregation for the second lecture for the Manhattan-Bronx sector. The lecture will be held on Monday evening, February 20, in the auditorium of the synagogue house. The guest speaker will be Dr. Norman Frimer, Metropolitan Regional Director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation. His topic will be: "Campus Youth — a Challenge."

The evening will consist of two parts. It will begin with a cocktail reception at 8:00 o'clock, at which members of our congregation will serve as hosts. The lecture itself will begin at 9:00 o'clock.
