Generosity of Heart

Speaking of the contributions made by the Children of Israel toward the construction of the Tabernacle, the Torah says: "And the men came with the women; all who were generous of heart brought . . . (their gifts)."

On this verse the Talmud comments as follows: we know the command, "Guard the words of your mouth and act in accordance with them." This teaches us that pledges which are spoken must be honored in deeds. How do we know that unspoken decisions must be honored similarly? This is taught by the verse: "All who were generous of heart brought . . ."

There are two thoughts which are inspired by this comment. The first is that good intentions are meaningless without realizing those intentions in action. There are philosophical systems which accept the intention exclusive of its realization. As long as a man wants to do the right thing, that is praiseworthy in itself. Judaism however gives no "A" for effort, only an "A" for effect.

The second thought is that a pious intention creates an obligation to act in accordance with it. Most societies expect a man to honor his word; Judaism expects him to honor his thoughts.

If a person is incapable of generosity of the heart, then we cannot criticize his failure to be generous in deed. If, however, he can arrive at the right emotional conclusion, if he instinctively comprehends the proper path, if he knows in his own soul what is right, this obligates him to act accordingly. A decision of the heart is every bit as compelling as a verbal pledge.

The argument "I know that I ought to act in a certain way, but I can't," has no moral justification according to the Talmudic view. When a man is capable of thinking nobly, we expect him to speak nobly and we consider him obligated to live nobly as well.

RABBI STEVEN RISKIN TO ADDRESS SISTERHOOD LUNCHEON MEETING, MARCH 20th

Another special event in the Sister-hood season will be held on Monday, March 20th, as part of the monthly open luncheon meetings. The program that day will feature one of the brightest young lights in the Orthodox rabbinate, Rabbi Steven Riskin, who will speak on the subject: "Reaching Out for the Unaffiliated — and for the Affiliated too."

Rabbi Riskin is the dynamic and resourceful spiritual leader of the new and vibrant congregation on the west side known as the Lincoln Square Synagogue. In but three years of dedicated work, together with a devoted corps of followers, he has turned what could have become a religious wasteland into a spiritual garden.

To visit his synagogue is to find the widest spectrum of Jewry, ranging from the most learned Orthodox to the untutored and unaffiliated, joining together in spirited prayer, enthusiastic study, and general religious fellowship. From a small handful of found-

ers, the congregation has grown to over three hundred families with a full program of activities including Men's Club, Sisterhood, Adult Education and Hebrew School. There is even a regular daily minyan composed of many men who, until recently, had not donned Tephillin for many years.

How does one go about reaching the unaffiliated? How can Jews who have been divorced from religious life be encouraged to recapture the meaning of our tradition? How can one approach the task of building a community of predominantly Ba'aley Teshuvah — returnees to Judaism? What relevance is there for the committed Jewish community in a program designed to reach out for the unaffiliated?

These are some of the questions that Rabbi Riskin will discuss in a lecture that promises to be informative, productive and inspiring. Come and bring your lady friends on March 20th.
