MAX J. ETRA RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT AT ANNUAL MEETING JOSEPH ROTH, ELGIN SHULSKY AND IRWIN SHAPIRO RE-ELECTED TO OFFICE

Ceremonies mark dedication of rooms and facilities in Synagogue House and Ramaz School Building

The assembly hall of the Synagogue House was filled with more than 250 members of the congregation as the Ninety-Fifth Annual Membership Meeting was called to order by the President, Max J. Etra.

By unanimous vote, the membership re-elected Max J. Etra as President for a 28th consecutive term. Reelected with him were Joseph Roth, Vice President; Elgin Shulsky, Treasurer and Irwin Shapiro, Secretary.

Following this presentation, the President delivered his annual report to the congregation. In that report, he thanked the members of the congregation for their generosity in making possible the new and enlarged buildings for Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz School.

A brief Memorial Service was held for those members of the congregation who passed away during the year.

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein offered moving eulogies in behalf of Abraham Ernst, Lillian Kaplan, Rose W. Kleinfeld and Bruno Scheidt.

The entire congregation stood in reverence as Cantor Cohen chanted the Memorial Prayer.

Membership Dues Increased

The membership of Kehilath Jeshurun, demonstrating an awareness of the growing needs of the congregation, unanimously passed the following resolution:

"Resolved that the membership dues in Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun be increased from \$200.00 to \$300.00 a year; that the dues for unmarried members be increased from \$100.00 to \$150.00 a year; that the dues for special members be similarly increased from \$100.00 to \$150.00.

Be it further resolved that the dues for junior members, which currently are \$50.00 a year, remain unchanged."

Ramaz School Meeting

The Ramaz Corporation, of which the members of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun are part, then held its Annual Meeting. The Chairman of the Ramaz Board of Trustees, A. Phillip Goldsmith, presided.




