Worshippers will recall the old days when Yizkor was invariably associated with an appeal for funds. In order to maintain the sanctity and dignity of the service we eliminated all such appeals.

In order, however, to fulfill the pledge for charity which is a regular part of the Yizkor service, we invite our worshippers to memorialize their dear departed ones by recording their names in our Book of Remembrance and by making a contribution in their memory once a year before Shavuoth.

We try to stress the purely religious character of the offering by limiting it to not more than ten dollars and not less than five dollars for each name to be memorialized.

KOSHER FOOD SPECIALTY SHOP OPENS IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

We are happy to announce that a new kosher food specialty shop, located at the corner of Lexington Avenue and 79th Street, has been endorsed by the Park East Kashruth Board.

The store, going under the name of "Operation Sino-Sinai," features a wide range of take-out foods for a kosher table. The store is operated on a Sabbath-observant basis and includes among its products, also, baked goods from a Sabbath-observant bakery.

We are pleased to add this specialty shop to our list of kosher stores under the supervision of the Park East Kashruth Board, a joint venture of the synagogues in the midtown, East side area.

LATE AFTERNOON CLASSES MEET ON THE SABBATH

During this spring season, there are two classes which will be meeting every Sabbath afternoon. Members and friends of the congregation — young and old, men and women — are invited to participate in these classes.

One hour before Mincha services, a Talmud class will meet to study the eighth chapter of the tractate, Berakhot. The subject matter concerns customs and ceremonies revolving about the table. The plan is to complete this chapter by Shavuoth time and to conduct a siyum on the first night of the festival at the tikkun ceremonies. In the absence of Rabbi Haskel Lookstein this week, the Talmud class will be conducted by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein.

Each week, from now and throughout the summer, a selection from the third chapter of the "Ethics of the Fathers" will be discussed by one of the rabbis between Mincha and Ma'ariv. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein will begin this study with the first passage from the third chapter this Saturday afternoon. An invitation is extended to all to attend Mincha services, listen to the lecture and remain for Ma'ariv thereafter.
