The class of 1967 has been officially graduated from Ramaz High School, as this Bulletin goes to press. Among the fifty-three graduates are four junior members of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun: Larry Breindel, Peter Feldman, Barbara Spilky, and Sharon Wolf.

This class distinguished itself by an excellent record in the competition for scholarships sponsored by the New York State Board of Regents. One of its members was a semi-finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Competition and a recipient of honorable mention in the Westinghouse Science Talent Search.

Three students in the class earned a position as semi-finalists in the National Honor Society Competition. In addition, students in the class earned a variety of honors and awards.

The college entrance record of the class of 1967 continued the enviable standard which has come to be expected of Ramaz High School. Besides the City Colleges to which most of the students were admitted, the following are some among the more than thirty-five colleges which admitted seniors from Ramaz this year: Barnard, Bennington, University of Chicago, Columbia, Cornell, M.I.T., N.Y.U., Stonybrook, Rutgers, Simmons, Skidmore, Stern College, University of Pennsylvania, University of Rochester, Wisconsin, Yeshiva University.

Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun, which is the sponsoring body for Ramaz School, has reason to be proud of the achievements of the class of 1967. Our best wishes are extended to the graduates, to their parents and to the teachers and administration of the school who contributed to the excellent record of this class.

AUXILIARY SERVICES FOR COMING HIGH HOLY DAYS

Plans have now been completed for Auxiliary Services to be conducted by Kehilath Jeshurun for the High Holy Day season, commencing October 5, 1967. The services will be held in the beautiful, air conditioned, auditorium of our synagogue house.

THE NEED

For several years it has become apparent that such a service would inevitably be necessary as part of the congregation's religious activities. The membership family has continued to grow from year to year while seating space in the main synagogue remains fixed. Seats in the ladies' balcony have been particularly scarce in recent years.

This year, of course, with the High Holy Days occurring late in the season, we expect that almost all of our members will wish to be accommodated with a reserved seat. We are, therefore, inaugurating the auxiliary service at this time.

THE PLANS

The services in our Synagogue

House will parallel those in the main synagogue in every respect. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein and Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will officiate and will alternate in delivering the sermons at both services. The traditional melodies and the order of service to which our congregants have become accustomed will prevail at both services. We have made arrangements for an excellent cantor to officiate at the auxiliary service and for the other essential religious functionaries.

In every respect, therefore, members and seat holders who will attend the service in the Synagogue House will find that only the location will be different. Everything else will be the same. The auditorium will, of course, be provided with the furnishings and decor to make the services there inspiring and memorable.

We are confident that this new congregational function will make our members more comfortable for the High Holy Days and will also serve as a valuable contribution to the religious welfare of the community.

Saturday Afternoon Class Continues

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will continue to conduct the special class on Sabbath afternoons during the summer. The subject of the class will be the Grace after Meals.

The members of the class will study directly from the Shulchan Aruch with the commentary of Mishnah B'rurah. The laws of the grace after meals will be discussed in detail and the significance of the entire institution will, of course, be analyzed.

This class will meet for one hour before Mincha on those Sabbath afternoons when Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will be in the city during the summer.


