FINAL PASSOVER NOTES Disposal of Chametz

No chametz may be eaten this Friday after 9:30 A.M. All chametz must be completely disposed of by 10:30 A.M.

Sale of Chametz

The ritual sale of chametz must be completed by early Friday morning. There are those who prefer to perform this ritual in person. The Rabbis and the Ritual Director are available for that purpose, through early Friday morning.

Services for First Born

Passover Eve is a traditional fast for first born. It is obligatory upon every first born who cannot observe the fast on Friday, April 12th, to attend the special service on that day and to participate at its conclusion in the light collation that is served. The service for the first born (Siyum Bechorim) will be held in the Chapel on Friday as part of the regular morning service. It will begin at 7:30.

The attendance at this service grows from year to year. We urge all first born to make a special effort to attend.

A HOLIDAY MESSAGE "This Is The Matzoh of Hope"

In last week's Bulletin there appeared a special formula which is to be recited immediately prior to the asking of the Four Questions on both nights at the Seder table. The formula is recited while holding in one hand the fourth matzoh on the table, a matzoh which we do not eat and which remains on our table as a symbol of hope for three million Jews in the Soviet Union, as well as all persecuted Jews around this troubled world.

It need not be stressed that every household ought to observe this ritual scrupulously. Our people instinctively understand that matzoh is more than a yearly ritual. It symbolizes freedom, the struggle for human dignity, the depression of slavery as well as the hope for redemption.

Surely this symbol ought to be highlighted by remembering Jews who are persecuted around the world. Most of them are denied even the right to eat matzoh on Passover. Far more crucial rights of the spirit and of the flesh are also denied them. We dare not forget these fellow Jews at our Seder table.

Says Raban Gamliel — as quoted in our Haggadah — whoever does not understand the ritual of matzoh has not fulfilled the obligation of telling the story of the Exodus. What Raban Gamliel is saying is that it is not only important for us to **eat** matzoh on Passover night but to **understand** its message: a message of bondage and freedom, a message of poverty and enlargement, a message of persecution and deliverance.

We must understand this message as it applies to our history at the time of the Exodus. Surely, however, we must understand it as it applies to our present situation also. If we do so understand it, we may offer a collective prayer that next year the meaning of matzoh will be purely a historical one, and all Israel will be able to eat the "bread of affliction" purely as a symbol of the past while we enjoy collectively a redemptive present.


