A MESSAGE FOR

ISRAEL INDEPENDENCE DAY

"This is the day the Lord hath made; let us rejoice and be happy thereon."

This verse, taken from the Psalms and associated with Hallel, was used by our sages to describe events of monumental proportions which revealed the hand of God in ensuring the survival of the Jewish People. We read that verse on the three pilgrimage festivals. We sing it on Chanukah. It has become the refrain in the liturgy of the Chief Rabbinate arranged specially for Israel Independence Day.

We had ample reason in the past to appreciate the significance and appropriateness of that verse in terms of the reconstruction of the Jewish State. Since last year, however, we have so much more reason to be grateful for, and to rejoice in, the Divine Providence displayed in behalf of the Jewish State and its 2.3 million Jewish inhabitants.

We now know what it is to face a Red Sea in front of us and the Egyptians behind us and to cross that sea miraculously and then to sing a song of joyful triumph to God.

We now know what it is to face persecution and spiritual annihilation at the hand of the Greeks and then to revolt in Maccabean style and to triumph as the few over the many, the weak over the strong, the pure over the contaminated; and then to sing a song of praise to God for His share in that triumph.

We know all of this because we not only relive Chanukah and Passover in a ritual fashion, but we also have relived it personally as participants in the great crisis and even greater deliverance of May and June, 1967. Surely then, this Israel Independence Day will be "The day the Lord has made for us to be joyous and happy thereon."

I believe it was Professor Peli, at the opening Men's Club lecture of the year this season, who pointed out that immediately following that joyous verse in Hallel there appears the verse: "Oh Lord save us." His observation was that somehow even the greatest deliverance leaves in its wake many problems and crisis which require God's continuous providence and watchfulness. Surely, the events since last June confirm this observation in our own minds.

Let us, therefore, be joyous and happy this year on Israel Independence Day. Let us all turn out en masse

SABBATH AFTERNOON CLASS IN LAWS OF TEPHILLIN TO BEGIN THIS WEEK

This Saturday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock, one hour before Mincha, Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will conduct the first in a series of classes on the laws of Tephillin. These classes will be held every Sabbath afternoon until the Shavuot festival. The final session will be held on the first night of Shavuot as the special study session for that evening.

The class will review the laws and significance of Tephillin as contained in the Code of Jewish Law, with the commentary of the Mishna B'rurah. Texts will be available to all students. The language of instruction will be English.

A cordial invitation is extended to men and women — adults and young people — to attend the first session this Saturday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock, in the library of the synagogue.

RAMAZ TO MARCH IN SALUTE TO ISRAEL PARADE SUNDAY MORNING, APRIL 28th

Fifth Avenue will be the scene of this year's Salute to Israel Parade which will honor the Twentieth Anniversary of the founding of the State of Israel. The parade will take place on Sunday morning, April 28th. At 11:00 a.m. sharp; the marchers will begin on Fifth Avenue and 57th Street and proceed-northward to 78th Street.

The guest of honor will be General Yitzhak Rabin, Ambassador of Israel to the United States and the heroic Chief of Staff of Israel's defense forces during the six day war. Honorary marshalls who will join with General Rabin in the viewing stand at 69th Street will include Mayor Lindsay and other prominent public figures. It is expected that the governors and senators of New York, Connecticut and New Jersey will also make an appearance.

At last year's parade over 200,000 people demonstrated during the period of crisis. With the Middle East situation still unsettled, it is most important for members of the Kehilath Jeshurun family and parents and friends of Ramaz School to help make a splendid showing for this year's event. This kind of support is well received in Israel and attention is paid to it by political figures in America.

Ramaz will be represented by its entire Upper School students, faculty and administration. The highlight of the Ramaz marching section will be a magnificent float which will express a special theme.
