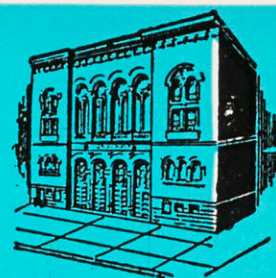

We are pleased to report that once again Kehilath Jeshurun will hold an Auxiliary Service for the coming High Holy Days.

Worshippers who attended the Auxiliary Service last year, were impressed with all facets of that service. We assure them that the same warm welcome, comfortable accommodations and inspiring services await them this year.

An Explanation to Newcomers

Kehilath Jeshurun arranges an Auxiliary Service to accommodate our expanding membership and friends in the community. Unfortunately, we cannot possibly accommodate all who would like to worship in our main Synagogue. The Auxiliary Services are conducted in the beautiful air-conditioned Auditorium of our Synagogue House. They parallel the services held in the Main Synagogue in every respect. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein and Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will officiate and will alternate in delivering the sermons at the services. The melodies, the order of service and the dignity to which congregants at Kehilath Jeshurun have been accustomed, will prevail at both services. Excellent cantors and religious functionaries will officiate at the Auxiliary Service.

HE WHO MOURNS THE DESTRUCTION OF JERUSALEM WILL YET REJOICE IN ITS RESURRECTION (Ta'anit, 30b)

Never in history have these words from the Talmud conveyed more meaning than for our generation and our day.

Our generation has witnessed the re-establishment of the State of Israel after almost 2,000 years of Jewish statelessness. The tears and mourning of countless generations of our people kept alive a hope and faith that some day redemption would come.

Twenty years ago the dream came true, but it came true only in part. A state was born, but its boundaries were slim; its security was tenuous; and its neighbors had pledged that the tenure of the state would be short-lived.

From June 5th through June 10th of last year all of this was changed. Through the miraculous victory of the Defence Forces of Israel, the security of the land has been enhanced, the borders have been extended and the threats of Israel's neighbors have been reduced to words; words which have not even proven effective in the United Nations with the powerful diplomatic support of the Soviet Union.

We in America who lived in the proverbial "sack cloth and ashes" during the crisis that preceded the Six Day War, have seen our mourning turn to rejoicing. Our fight for Israel's survival was transformed into a vicar-

ious thrill and pride in her glorious triumph.

V'Al ha-Kol, and above and beyond all this, we have witnessed the return of Jerusalem to the dominion of Israel. Jerusalem, the site of our ill-fated Temple, the locus of its Western wall, the place toward which every Jewish heart turns in prayer: Jerusalem is ours! We who have long mourned its destruction can now rejoice in the prospect of its reconstruction.

The future, with God's help, can be bright indeed. There is, however, much for which to pray and mourn. Close to one thousand young Israeli lives were lost and still die or are wounded in daily incidents. Peace in the Holy Land is still a dream, though perhaps somewhat closer to realization than it was a year ago. The Old City of Jerusalem still lies in ruins, its Holy places decimated, its Temple only an image in our eyes.

This weekend provides us with an opportunity to reflect on all of these things. Join us for Shabbat Chazon and for the special Tisha B'Av services on Saturday night and Sunday morning, and let us pray together that the full reconstruction of Jerusalem and the all encompassing peace in the Holy Land will yet be realized in our day.

TISHA B'AV SERVICES

During the past several years, the observance of Tisha B'Av at Kehilath Jeshurun has become a more meaningful experience. The congregation has introduced a new Prayer Book, purchased through the generosity of the Men's Club, which makes the service more intelligible to worshippers.

The Prayer Book is an attractive volume which features an excellent translation of the Book of Lamentations and the traditional dirges for Tisha B'Av. It contains excellent explanatory notes, which worshippers will find useful and enlightening.

Tisha B'Av this year occurs this Saturday evening, August 3rd and Sunday, August 4th. We will begin the day with a brief discourse by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein between Mincha and Ma'ariv on Saturday evening. This will be followed by the evening service and the reading of Lamentations.

On Sunday we will, of course, hold a special service in the morning at which appropriate dirges will be chanted. We will also conduct special Mincha services on Sunday evening.
