

KEHILATH JESHURUN HOST TO 20,000 AT MASS PRAYER AND PROTEST MEETING FOR IRAQI JEWRY

Thousands of Jews from the Metropolitan New York area occupied every seat in our Main Synagogue and overflowed throughout the entire area on 85th Street between Park and Lexington to participate in a mass prayer and protest meeting in connection with the brutal public execution of nine Iraqi Jews last week.

The program was sponsored by the Conference of Presidents of Major Jewish Organizations, the official umbrella organization which links together all major national Jewish groups throughout the country. Kehilath Jeshurun was honored to serve as the host and organizer of this historic meeting.

The occasion began with a service of worship led by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein and Cantor A. Joseph Cohen who were joined by Rabbi Gilbert Klaperman, President of the New York Board of Rabbis, and Rabbi Herschel Schacter, Chairman of the Presidents' Conference. The service consisted of the responsive reading of Psalms in Hebrew and in English, in addition to other prayers.

The program of the meeting included several addresses, including two by non Jewish clergymen and one unforgettable speech by a brother of one of the martyred Iraqi Jews.

The theme of the evening was "Let My People Go" and it was echoed by all present, including many notables from all walks of life — Jewish and non Jewish, black and white. At several points during the program there was hardly a dry eye among the 1500 worshippers that crowded our synagogue to capacity.

March to Iragi Mission

The entire assemblage then marched impressively to the Iraqi Mission to the United Nations on 79th Street and Fifth Avenue, where a petition was delivered to the officials of the Iraqi Government. It was a tragic moment in the history of New York Jewry; but it was also a moment of impressive solidarity which reflected the sensitivity of our community and its friends to the needs and welfare of world Jewry.

This was also an historic occasion for Kehilath Jeshurun. We are grateful to all those who made the detailed preparations to accommodate such a meeting, and to the members of the congregation and the seniors of Ramaz School, who helped to carry out many of these preparations. May our future gatherings be held as celebrations and in happiness.

MEN'S CLUB TO HONOR RABBI JOSEPH H. LOOKSTEIN AT 30th ANNUAL DINNER, TUESDAY, MARCH 18th

A Different Type of Commandment

The revelation at Mt. Sinai marks the formal acceptance of an incorporeal God by the Jewish People. This idea of incorporeality was as strange to the world as was the message which was revealed to the Jewish people at Sinai.

The idolators knew of gods only as providers. In cafeteria-like style the idolators sought from their gods economic plenty, fruitfulness, rain, sun, victory and the like. They could never conceive of God in a non-physical sense — as a teacher.

As a direct challenge to this view, the Ten Commandments begins: "I am the Lord thy God who took you out of the Land of Egypt . . . "If that were the end, then Judaism would have merely become another idolator's cult, worshipping a god of war, a splitter of seas and a miraculous redeemer. God reveals himself at Mt. Sinai, however, as a spiritual teacher who cares enough to teach his people how to live: keep the Sabbath; honor parents; do not murder.

In the year 1300 B.C.E. these were not the kinds of commands which might have been expected from God. What might have been expected would be commandments to offer incense, to bring sacrifices and to build a sumptuous temple. These were the traditional "commands" from corporeal deities.

What the Torah presents in the initial message of revelation is of an entirely different character. God reguires conformity to a holy and moral way of life. Recite the Kiddush; do not steal; do not be unfaithful in matrimony. This is far more than the gift of life from a fertility deity. This is a gift which teaches us how to use life, how to fulfill life and how to ennoble life.

This is the spiritual message from the incorporeal Father and Teacher of mankind.



RABBI SHLOMO GOREN THRILLS AUDIENCE OF OVER THREE HUNDRED AT MEN'S CLUB CONVOCATION


Some three hundred listeners filled the Auditorium of our Synagogue House almost to overflowing to hear the Chief Chaplain of Israel's Defense Forces, Rabbi Shlomo Goren, deliver a stirring address on the state of affairs in Israel today.

The Rabbi, who is also Chief Rabbi elect of Tel Aviv, electrified the crowd with his strength, his confidence, and his stories of faith. He also displayed a magnificent sense of humor, punctuating his serious remarks with light and clever comments and asides.

Because of the multitude of activities that are presently going on in the congregation, space in this Bulletin does not permit us to review the speech of Rabbi Goren. Suffice it to say that everyone present left with a feeling of encouragement, strengthening and a new confidence in the future of Israel and in its successful struggle for peace and security.

The meeting was chaired by Martin R. Rochlin, President of the Men's Club. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein introduced Rabbi Goren in a stirring manner. The meeting closed with a special prayer read by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein and with the memorial prayer chanted in behalf of the Iraqi Jews by Cantor A. Joseph Cohen.

Following the meeting, the assemblage repaired to the Social Hall where everyone present had an opportunity to greet Rabbi Goren personally. It was a memorable occasion in the annals of Kehilath Jeshurun and its Men's Club.
