"Be a 'Tamim' "

At the age of ninety-nine years, according to Biblical chronology, Abraham is given the culminating command of his life as he prepares to enter the covenant with God: "Walk before Me and be 'tamim' " (perfect). Abraham had already displayed a genius for goodness and benevolence, a compulsion for selflessness and modesty, a powerful drive for giving and a strong reluctance to taking. What is the perfection (temimut) that is now required of the father of the Jewish people? I think its meaning is, first of all, a level of faith in Halakha, a simple belief that the way of Torah is the best way.

There are many people who adhere to Jewish Law without having any faith in it. We are all products of a secular environment, an environment in which religion and spirituality are tolerated, but not really appreciated. The object of our respect is not the spiritual man, but the practical and successful man; not the pious man, but the man who "makes it big."

There is a very simple way to prove your own faith - or lack of it - in the way of Torah. If you had a son, what would you prefer he be known as (assuming you had to make a choice). a tzadik or a successful businessman? As he grows up, what do you observe more: his marks or his spiritual qualities? Suppose he said to you one day that he had decided to go to Israel and devote his life to Talmudic scholarship — a rather poor paying profession. You would probably tell him to take a cold shower, get over this nonsense and sit down to do his math homework. And then you would run the next day to his school - even his Day School at that - and ask the principal what kind of a utopian dream world he thinks he is operating.

We all know the folklore jokes about people who take their religion too seriously. They are considered fools, not saints; tipshim, not tzadikim.

This, of course, is precisely what God required of Abraham. Be a tamim — simple in your faith; believe and have confidence that what the Torah tells us to do is the best for us, even if we cannot fully comprehend its value.

Nachmanides, in his commentary on our verse, cites the hope of the psalmist: "Let my heart be tamim in thy statutes so that I may be not ashamed." What the psalmist is praying for is the faith to be so sure of himself that no one who makes fun of his piety will deter him from the right behavior. He prays: let me have absolute trust that walking before God is best for me and let me experience no embarrassment in walking that way, though the multitudes mock and criticize me.

"Hithalekh l'fanai v'heyeh tamim."
"Walk before me and be perfect."

HEADLINES OF JEWISH INTEREST Shocking Postscript to International Piracy

Last week, the Syrian Government released the two Arab terrorists who hijacked an Israel-bound T.W.A. jet and brought it to Damascus on August 29th. At the same time, two Israeli men passengers remain in Syrian custody.

Rabbi Herschel Schacter, Chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, sent a telegram to U. Thant in which he deplored "the impotence of the U.N. in securing the release of the two kidnapped victims." At the same time, the Washington Post on Wednesday, October 15th, challenged the "regional logrolling" by the United Nations which, it said, will lead to Syria's election this week to a seat on the Security Council."

"How can a country claim a shred of self respect or international standing when it treats the admitted perpetrators of a criminal act as though they were the victims and the victims as though they were the criminals," the paper asked. "A more unseemly instance of putting politics over principle is hard to imagine," the editorial said

ARE YOU POOR OR RICH?

"Hillel will cause the poor to be found guilty; Rabbi Eliezer Ben Charsum will cause the rich to be found guilty." So say the sages of the Talmud, giving the following explanation: At the final judgment when the soul stands before the heavenly court, one of the questions put to him is, "Why did you not study Torah?" The reply may be, "I was poor and too busy trying to make a living; I had no time to study Torah." This answer will be rejected by the court, for he was certainly no poorer than Hillel who used to work for half a day and earn a trifling half-dinar. He would give half of this coin to the doorkeeper of the Torah study-hall to be allowed to listen to the discourse of the two great Rabbis and scholars Shmaya and Avtalyon. The other half of his wages would go for his family and himself.

Another excuse offered the heavenly court might be, "I was a man of affairs. My time was completely taken up in running my business. I had no time to study Torah." This answer is also rejected, for the accused was certainly no wealthier than Rabbi Eliezer Ben Charsum who inherited a thousand townships and a thousand ships at sea, yet he went from town to town and from country to country to study Torah, carrying his frugal provisions on his back. Wealth was no obstacle for Rabbi Eliezer.

Poor or rich — or just middle class — you ought to feel, as a Jew, a compelling need to study your tradition, your heritage, your history. It is not too late to join our classes for the year. 
