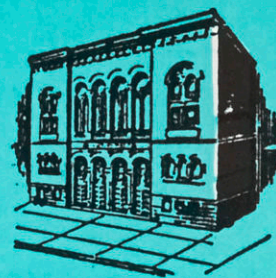

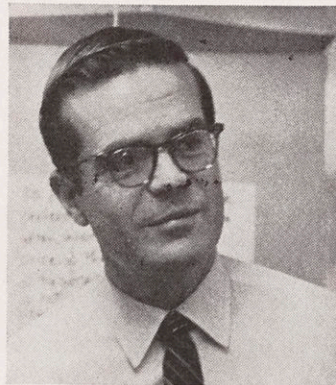

It satisfies the obligation of the season while reinforcing the primacy of the spiritual over the material which is the essential message of the festival. "Not by strength or by might but by my spirit, saith the Lord", is the Biblical slogan for Chanukah.

In keeping with this thought, here are some suggestions for your magazine gift giving.

Tradition — a journal of Orthodox Jewish thought. Published quarterly by the Rabbinical Council of America. It should be read in every traditional Jewish home. Subscription: \$5.00 for one year; \$8.00 for 2 years.

Judaism—a somewhat more esoteric journal dealing with matters of intellectual concern to the Jew and his community. Published quarterly by the American Jewish Congress, 15 East 84th St. New York, N.Y. 10028. Subscription price: \$6.00 (\$4.00 for students).

Commentary — the Jewish community's version of Harper's or the Atlantic. Recently, the magazine has placed greater emphasis on matters of Jewish concern without sacrificing its broader appeal. Published monthly by the American Jewish Committee, 165 East 56th St., New York, N.Y. 10022. Subscription price: \$9.00.

The Jerusalem Post — a special weekly edition of articles is air mailed on Monday from Jerusalem, arriving on Tuesday. An excellent source for news, reviews and the atmosphere of Israeli life. Annual subscription: \$18.00. Write to the Jerusalem Post Weekly, 10 E. 44 St., N.Y.C. 10017.

Panim El Panim — a well written, colorful, lively, weekly magazine from Israel published and edited by Pinchas Peli among others. A wonderful source for news and views, personality and institutional portraits, and, with it all, a delightful way to learn the new words, idioms and style of Israeli Hebrew. Subscription: \$18.00. 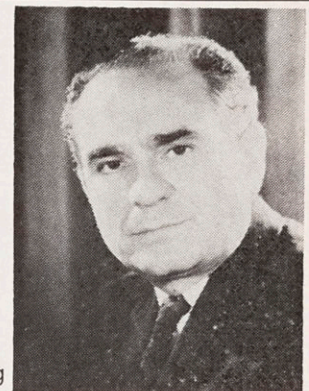

THE GOVERNMENT HELPS YOU GIVE CHARITY

America is one of the few governments in the world that encourages the giving of private charity by allowing the donor to take a tax deduction for his gifts.

It is good to bear this thought in mind now during the weeks as the outgoing calendar year is coming to a close. There are many business men who may realize that they are still in a position to make gifts to worthy causes. It would be extremely wise for them to take advantage of that.

This is a thought for the months of November and December, as the year comes to a close. Remember that the institutions and causes to which you will give will give you their blessing. The government will give you sanction and approval, and God will reward you.

"Halakha In The Moon Age"

The Subject of Dr. Rosenfeld's lecture

The third lecture in the series sponsored by the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute promises to be unlike any ever offered under similar auspices. Both the subject and the speaker are sui generis.

Among the kinds of questions to be discussed by Dr. Rosenfeld will be the following: How does one observe the sabbath in space? What are some of the religious problems involved in brain transplants? What is the Halakhik position on refrigeration and resuscitation of the critically ill? What might be the religious status of robots? These questions can only be discussed — whether seriously or with tongue in cheek — by a man who is well versed in the scientific and mathematical disciplines as well as the study of Torah in all its aspects. Such a combination is rare, even in our day. Perhaps the most supreme example of this combination in our generation is our guest lecturer, Dr. Azriel Rosenfeld.

The holder of a Bachelor's Degree from Yeshiva College, three master Degrees in mathematics and Hebrew literature, a Doctorate of Hebrew Letters in rabbinic literature from Yeshiva University and a Ph.D. in mathematics from Columbia, Dr. Rosenfeld qualifies as an expert on scientific subjects and on halakhic studies.

He is the author of three books and some forty papers. At present, he has four articles awaiting publication in various scientific journals and a learned analysis of "Fragments of the Commentary of Nahmanides' student on the Tractates of Yomah and Sukkah" (in Hebrew) which is to be published in the Rabbi Samuel K. Mirsky Memorial Volume.

Dr. Rosenfeld makes his home in the Washington, D.C. area. His brilliant career actually has its roots in this community. In June of 1943 he was in the first graduating class (together with four other students) from the Ramaz Elementary School.

We extend a special invitation to the readers of this Bulletin to come to listen to a fascinating personality discuss a most intriguing subject.
