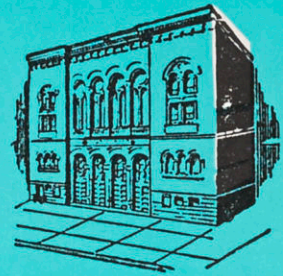

"AND YOU SHALL BE A LIGHT UNTO THE NATIONS . . ."

(The following is excerpted from an article by Milton Himmelfarb in Commentary, July 1969, entitled "Hebraism & Hellenism Now". H.L.)

When the Saturday Review asked Harold Macmillan whether Great Britain should try to be like Athens or like Sweden, he ruled out Athens — living on slavery, imperialist, warlike, and overtaken by decay and death. He continued: It may well be that Britain will someday follow in the footsteps of Sweden, but if so I'm glad I won't be here to see it.

No, the future I hope for Britain is more like that of Israel. In the time of Elizabeth we were only two million people, in the time of Marlborough only five or six million, in the time of Napoleon only ten million. The other day, while the world debated, Israel's three millions imposed their will on their enemies. They had what any great people need — resolution, courage, determination, pride. These are what really count in men and nations.

"FEAR NOT", by Moshe Dayan

(Israel's Minister of Defense, speaking at 1969 graduation ceremony of Tzahal's Officers School, drew upon the Bible to describe Israel's struggle for peace.)

The other day I was asked, "Mr. Defense Minister, where is it all going to end?" Now this is a very Jewish question. "What will be?" has been on our people's lips for 4,000 years.

Notice that I drop the word "end." That is because the Jewish emphasis has always been on the process and the struggle. "Menuha ve-nahala," peace and a homeland, have always been our desire. If, from time to time, we achieved these goals, it was only as temporary stops along the way. That is why it is better to say, "What will be?" than "What will be the end?"

This question came into being with the first Jew, Abraham. He had to inherit no fewer than ten nations and God said to him, "Fear not!"

Later, Isaac came to Gerar, quarreled over water with his neighbors, and despaired of settling in the land. Then God appeared to him and said, "Fear not, for I am with you."

This "fear not" became our people's motto, in the statement: "Fear not, O Jacob My Servant."

Now all through the generations the Jewish worry has been a twofold one: concern for the individual Jew, and

concern for the nation as a whole. Therefore I think that the answer that we are able to give to the question, "What will be?" is: "We shall continue to struggle."

So the words, "Fear not" do not mean "Don't worry." They mean "Don't be a coward! Never become frightened!"

Fortunately, our people are blessed with two mighty weapons. One is faith. The second is that we "fear not."

I had an example of this when I visited an outpost at Neve Ur in the Beisan Valley last week. I came upon a skeleton of a warrior of Joshua's day, with a food plate lying at his head and his bronze 12-inch sword at his side. All of us expressed admiration for Joshua's fighting men who had fought and conquered the land with such primitive weapons. They had guts!

But even in those days it was necessary to repeat the motto "Fear not." After Joshua captured the kings of Jerusalem, Hebron, Yarmuk, Lachish and Eglon, he assembled his senior staff and said to them, "Fear not, nor be dismayed; be strong and of good courage." For he understood that to "fear not" is necessary for our people in time of peace as well as in time of war.
