Similarly, we want to express our thanks to Dr. William Herzig who read the Torah throughout the month of July while Mr. Rosenberg was on vacation. Together with Mordie Mann, he also served as a part-time cantor during the summer months.

Farewell to the Finks

A high point on our summer calendar was observed on Shabbat Chazon, virtually on the eve of Tisha B'Av, when Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun took leave officially of Dr. and Mrs. Theodore Fink and their three children, Judy, Naomi and Daniel. The Fink family is the first member family of our congregation to take up residence in the land of Israel. Rabbi Haskel Lookstein spoke movingly of the many contributions which this family has made to the spirit and life of our congregation. The Finks were honored at a special kiddush held on that Sabbath.

Tisha B'Av

On August 10th and 11th the congregation held what were perhaps the most impressive Tisha B'Av services in its long history. Close to 200 worshippers gathered on Monday evening to hear the reading of Lamentations. The reading was divided among Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, Mr. Rosenberg, Joseph N. Friedman, Steven Gross and John Hellman. Each of them was seated in a different part of the synagogue in order to convey the feeling that lamentations were an outgrowth of the feeling of all of us who gathered for this occasion.

Perhaps it was the fact that this was the nineteen hundredth anniversary of the destruction of Jerusalem but somehow this Tisha B'Av seemed a little more meaningful than in the past. The congregation joined in chanting "Eicho," in reading the elegies and in listening to the special interpolations of the Rabbi.

On Tuesday morning the chapel was virtually filled to capacity for the regular service and for the reciting of Kinoth. Once again the mood was one of active participation and involve-

ment in the spirit of the day. This was carried over to the special evening services which were held at 7:30 on Tuesday and which were attended by over forty men. It was a wonderful conclusion to a moving day on our religious calendar.

In Memoriam

During the course of the summer months Kehilath Jeshurun suffered the loss of some of its most devoted members.

Mrs. Bessie Bornstein, the beloved wife of the immortal Thomas Bornstein, was called to her eternal reward after a long illness. Together with her husband she helped this congregation and left an indelible mark upon its life and history.

Hon. Samuel H. Hofstadter, Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of New York and member of this congregation for over forty years. Services were held for him in our Main Synagogue, attended by many of his colleagues on the bench. Justice Hofstadter was a brilliant jurist, learned in Jewish lore and committed to Jewish ideas and ideals.

Mrs. Elsie Engel, the beloved wife of our esteemed member Elmer Engel, passed away after a long and difficult illness. An elegant and artistocratic Jewish lady, she was the essence of refinement, beauty and love. We extend our sincerest condolences also to her daughter, Mrs. Martin Zimet.

Samuel Zuckerman, known to us as "the Judge". He was a regular worshipper at our daily services, a man of exceptional piety, meticulous integrity and outstanding goodness.
