This year again, three outstanding men of Kehilath Jeshurun have been singled out for the highest Torah honors of the year. They represent the best traditions of our congregation.

I. Robert Wassner, the Chasan Torah, is a Trustee of the synagogue who has been affiliated with us for over a decade following his service as Chairman of the Board of Congregation Bnai Yehuda in our neighborhood. Mr. Wassner is President of Arnav Industries and is widely respected as an outstanding leader in the garment industry.

Our Chasan Torah was born in Vienna and arrived in the United States after having lived and studied in Austria, Belgium, France and Switzerland. He is a descendant of many generations of Rabbis including the sainted Rabbi Yaakov Emdin and the Chacham Zvi. A grandson of the celebrated Bayaner Rov, Rabbi Judah Leib Sternhell, Mr. Wassner is also a devoted Chossid of the present Bayaner Rebbe.

He and his lovely wife Diane have made a home in our community at which many of the congregation are

frequent guests. The Wassners have been leading spirits in the work of the Shaare Tzedek Hospital in Jerusalem, the United Lubavitcher Yeshivoh and dozens of other important causes and institutions. He is also a founder of Bar-Ilan University. For the past two years, Mr. Wassner has been Honorary Grand Marshall of the Salute to Israel Parade on Fifth Avenue.

It is a privilege for the congregation to offer this man of piety, learning and genuine Jewish spirit the honor of Chasan Torah.

Norman Jaspan, the Chasan Bereshith, is also a member of a distinguished family which occupies a leading position in the Jewish community. A Trustee of our congregation and a faithful worshipper in our synagogue, Mr. Jaspan is following in the tradition of his father, who is a distinguished officer of the Jewish Center on the West Side.

The Schedule:

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2. Parents are requested to use their discretion about bringing very young children to the children's section for Simchath Torah. Younger children, if they are brought, should best remain with their parents.

3. Once having brought the children to the Social Hall, please leave their care to us. They will be escorted to the Main Synagogue and returned to the Social Hall after the service, where they will receive the special sweets without which this festival would be incomplete. Parents can meet their children after the service in the downstairs lobby of the synagogue house.

Mincha for the adults at 5:30 in the Main Synagogue, with Ma'ariv and Hakafoth to follow. Children between

the ages of five and twelve should be brought to the Social Hall at 5:45.

Friday Morning, October 23rd

Above all, do not forget the glorious celebration on Simchath Torah day. On that occasion, we conduct another full round of Hakafoth with singing and dancing for all; we complete the reading of one cycle of the Torah and we launch a new cycle; we call the Chasanim to their respective honors; and the entire celebration is capped by a delightful buffet kiddush where the mood of rejoicing, punctuated by singing and dancing of old and young alike, is quite inspiring.

Simchath Torah, day and night, are religious occasions of great joy in which every family should participate fully. Come and celebrate with us!
