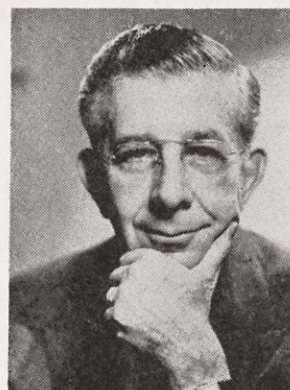

ABOUT OUR SHABBAT GUEST

General Ezer Weizman, a nephew of the late Dr. Chaim Weizmann, first President of the State of Israel, is a Sabra, born in Tel Aviv. His highest rank in Israel was earned while he was Chief of Operations of the Israel Air Force.

During World War II, he served as a fighter pilot with the R.A.F. in North Africa. He was one of the architects of Israel's fledgling Air Force during the War of Independence in 1948 and served as the Commander of its first

fighter squadron which at that time consisted of a few obsolescent World War II fighters.

One of Israel's outstanding national heroes, General Weizman developed the Air Force to prepare it for its greatest hour during the Six Day War. He is also a former Minister of Transport in the Cabinet.

We are proud to welcome this distinguished son of the State of Israel to the pulpit of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun next Sabbath.

Since leaving K.J., Mr. Comet served as Director of the Zionist Youth Foundation, in which capacity he conceived and developed the Annual Youth Salute to Israel Parade on Fifth Avenue. He also was one of the first coordinators of the American Jewish Conference on Soviet Jewry.

A specialist in community organization and international Jewish affairs, Ted is extremely well informed about the status of Jewry the world over. His particular discussion of French Jewry should provide a great deal of interest and information.
