#### WEEKLY CLASSES

#### TALMUD I

Our first Talmud class continues a tradition of many years in the congregation. It will be taught on Monday evenings as in the past. The class will continue the study of the final chapter of Pesachim which contains a fascinating legal analysis of the Seder and other related subjects in the field of prayer and blessings.

All the traditional commentaries are used to explicate the text. The course is given in English and is open to students who have some background in Talmud study.

#### TALMUD II

This year, for the first time, the Adult Institute will offer a second course in Talmud on Shabbat afternoons in an effort to make the study of Talmud available to those who may not be able to come on a weekday night. This class will study the tractate of Bezah, dealing with the laws of Shabbat and Yom Tov and presenting many of the concepts which form the foundation for Jewish holy days.

This study hour should greatly enhance the Shabbat afternoon atmosphere as well as serve as an important educational force in the community. The course will be conducted in English and should be intelligible to all interested students.

#### HEBREW TO READ SIDDUR BY

#### STUDIES IN THE WEEKLY PORTION

A class for women.

This year's Women's Study Group will feature a discussion of the Weekly Portion read on each Shabbat morning. One or two topics from each portion will be discussed in depth following a brief over-view of the entire portion:

The purpose is two-fold. First, it will provide an opportunity for serious Bible study. Second, it will afford Ramaz mothers an opportunity to "keep up with their children", inasmuch as all of the Lower School children are prepared each week for the Biblical portion.

# THE ADULT INSTITUTE SEMINAR PROGRAM

The word "seminar" in a school catalog implies that the student's role will not be a purely passive one. He is expected to produce knowledge as well as absorb it. There are outside readings and inside participation. Sessions are generally informal in nature.

Our seminar program, too, will fit this pattern. Sessions will be held in private homes rather than in classrooms. The schedule of meetings will be drawn up at the first session to fit the needs of all the participants. Outside readings will be suggested but not mandatory.

This is a new format for our Adult Institute. We think it will serve your needs well. We hope you feel the same way. Here are the programs:

# Seminar in Prophetic Literature

This course will meet for five sessions in the homes of students. The subject matter will be the Prophetic literature of the Second Temple. The books to be studied will be Ezra, Chagai and Malachi.

The instructor for this course will be Dr. Meyer Hershkovics, Professor of Bible and Jewish History at Yeshiva University. Rabbi Hershkovics is well known to students in our Adult Institute as a fascinating teacher and a profound thinker. We know that his return to our Institute will be welcomed by many.

(Future sessions will be determined in accordance with the convenience and schedules of the students in the group and the instructor.)

# **Reading and Discussion Groups**

#### An Am HaSefer Program

# Study Group in World Jewish Issues

This group will meet together to discuss a series of problems in the world Jewish community. The source material for the discussion will come from special publications from the Department of Policy Planning and Research of the Synagogue Council of America. The first three subjects and materials will be as follows:

- Public Aid to Non-Public Education A series of papers delivered at a national conference on this issue. Among the authors are William Brickman, Seymour Lachman and Judd Teller.
- 2. The Jewish Religion in the USSR Zvi Gitelman.
- The U.S. and Israel A study of anticipated policies for the next five years by Nadav Safran.

Here is a splendid opportunity to discuss some of the most important issues that affect the Jewish community today and to do so with sufficient background and information. Notice of the date and location of the first meeting will be sent to all registrants.
