### 20,000 JEWS TO GATHER IN MADISON SQUARE GARDEN MONDAY, DECEMBER 13th WILL YOU BE THERE?

The special program "Freedom Lights for Soviet Jewry," will be held at Madison Square Garden on Monday evening, December 13th at 7:30 P.M.

This occasion will demonstrate the support of New York Jewry for our brethren in the Soviet Union. It will highlight the specific message of Chanukah that the Jewish spirit and religion will not be extinguished by the tyranny of any government or power on this earth.

Your presence is essential if this demonstration is to be a success. Your presence carries even more importance in view of the unfortunate statements made by a State Department official at the Congressional hearings in Washington, last week.

## RABBI AND MRS. JOSEPH H. LOOKSTEIN RETURN FROM VENEZUELA

Rabbi and Mrs. Joseph H. Lookstein spent eight days in Caracas, Venezuela, where they went in the interests of

Bar-Ilan University.

While in Caracas, the World Jewish Congress of Latin America had its conference. The Rabbi greeted the conference at its opening and on the following day delivered a lengthy address on the state of Jewish education in the world. He did that in his former capacity as Chairman of the World Conference of Jewish Education. The Rabbi's stay in Caracas was helpful in advancing the cause of traditional Judaism in that very important city of fifteen thousand Jews. He preached to an audience of some 700 people in the main synagogue of Caracas, which is ministered to by Rabbi Pinchus Brenner as Chief Rabbi. Rabbi Brenner was a former student of Rabbi Lookstein at Yeshiva University.

The Rabbi also visited the recently established Yavneh School, which is a day school patterned after Ramaz and which during its three years of existence, already has some 175 stu-

dents.

### 204 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN ADULT INSTITUTE COURSES

### New Students Still Welcome

We know that you will be pleased to learn that the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute has opened with the finest enrollment in many years. Men and women of all ages have seized upon the opportunities offered them for advanced and elementary studies. They have demonstrated by their response that adult education has a vital place in a traditional synagogue. For your information we present the following facts about each of our courses.

### TALMUD I

### Registration: 16 students

This course meets every Monday evening from 8:30 to 9:30 for the study of the tenth chapter of the Tractate, Pesachim, dealing with the Seder rituals and other pertinent matters. Students of a variety of backgrounds can benefit from the course.

Next session: Monday evening, 8:30

### TALMUD II

### Registration: 28 students

This class meets every Shabbat afternoon about 45 minutes before Mincha for the study of the Tractate, Beizah. The large and varied student body has produced some excellent discussions and discoveries. The practical problems of Yom Tov and Shabbat are analyzed as part of this course.

Spending the better part of an hour in Talmud study on Shabbat afternoons is a wonderful way in which to crown the day. Even on these short afternoons the schedule is so arranged as to allow time for a brief nap.

Next session: Saturday afternoon, 3:45

### ULPAN I and II Registration: 38 students

The outstanding response of the women of the congregation and Ramaz to a serious course in conversational Hebrew has forced us to divide the class into two sections. The beginners group meets on Mondays from 9:15 to 10:50 A.M. The non-beginners (not quite intermediates) meet on Wednesdays at the same time.

Both classes are taught by Mrs. Efrat Abrams, an accomplished and talented Ulpan teacher with years of experience in this field. Students can still enroll in either of these sections and benefit from the year's work.

Next session: This Monday or Wednesday, 9:15

### STUDIES IN THE WEEKLY PORTION Registration: 50 students

An enthusiastic response has greeted the organization of this course which offers a summary of the Weekly Portion and an in-depth analysis of one or two themes from it. The goal of the course is to stimulate interest in the Torah reading for the following Shabbat and also to provide mothers with the necessary information with which to stimulate a family discussion of the Weekly Portion around the Friday night table.

Next session: Monday, 11:00 A.M.

### SEMINAR IN PROPHETIC LITERATURE Registration: 28 students

This course has been meeting with Rabbi Mayer Hershkovics. It has held two sessions in the homes of the Looksteins and the Shudofskys. The study of the book of Ezra is being undertaken in a serious way with thorough historical and textual analysis.

The opportunity to study from a master of Prophetic literature like Rabbi Hershkovics is one which ought not to be missed. The level of discussion in the class is extremely high although the backgrounds of the students vary widely. Our next session will be held at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Charles Cohen, 5 West 86th Street.

Next session: Tuesday, 8:00 P.M.

### HEBREW TO READ SIDDUR BY

### Registration: 14 students

This course has completed its third week of study. The students in the class are serious in their attempt to learn how to read Hebrew. Their goal is well within sight during the course of the next five sessions which will complete the course.

Mrs. Charles Cohen, the instructor, informs us that students can still be accommodated in this course at its next session.

Next session: Monday, 8:00 P.M.

In addition to the above courses which are already functioning, the Adult Institute has 15 registrants for the study group in World Jewish Issues and a similar number for an Am HaSefer program. Both of these programs will begin shortly.

We are very pleased with the results thus far but we are anxious to accommodate all. The need for Jewish education lasts as long as a Jew lives and breathes. It is a need common to men and women. It is a need which must be fulfilled.
