His message will be an extremely important one for our membership.

It was a very proud moment for Kehilath Jeshurun when at the Inaugural Dinner for the New York UJA the congregation was honored for its outstanding record of participation in UJA and one of its most distinguished members, Jack D. Weiler, was cited as the guest of honor at this outstanding affair. We are happy to print a few of the beautiful sentiments expressed about Mr. Weiler in the program.

"We do not remember when the title Mr. UJA was conferred on Jack D. Weiler. There was never any formal ceremony nor is there any entry in the archives. It is an altogether spontaneous designation and it may date from the late forties and early fifties when Jack was attending as many as four and five UJA meetings every day and night.

"Jack would walk into a room where men were gathered in support of UJA and the whispers began to reverberate — 'Here comes Mr. UJA'. That is exactly what Jack has been as long as most of us can recall and that is what he is today.

"The Herbert J. Lehman Memorial Award which Jack receives this evening gives concrete recognition to his years of dynamic leadership and extraordinary generosity. In accepting this honor he joins the select company of such men as David Ben-Gurion, Sir Isaac Wolfson, Edward M. M. Warburg and William Rosenwald.

"Nevertheless, Jack is unique. Some call him the guiding light of UJA; others describe him as a dynamo, a one-man campaign. But everyone recognizes him as 'Mr. UJA' ".
