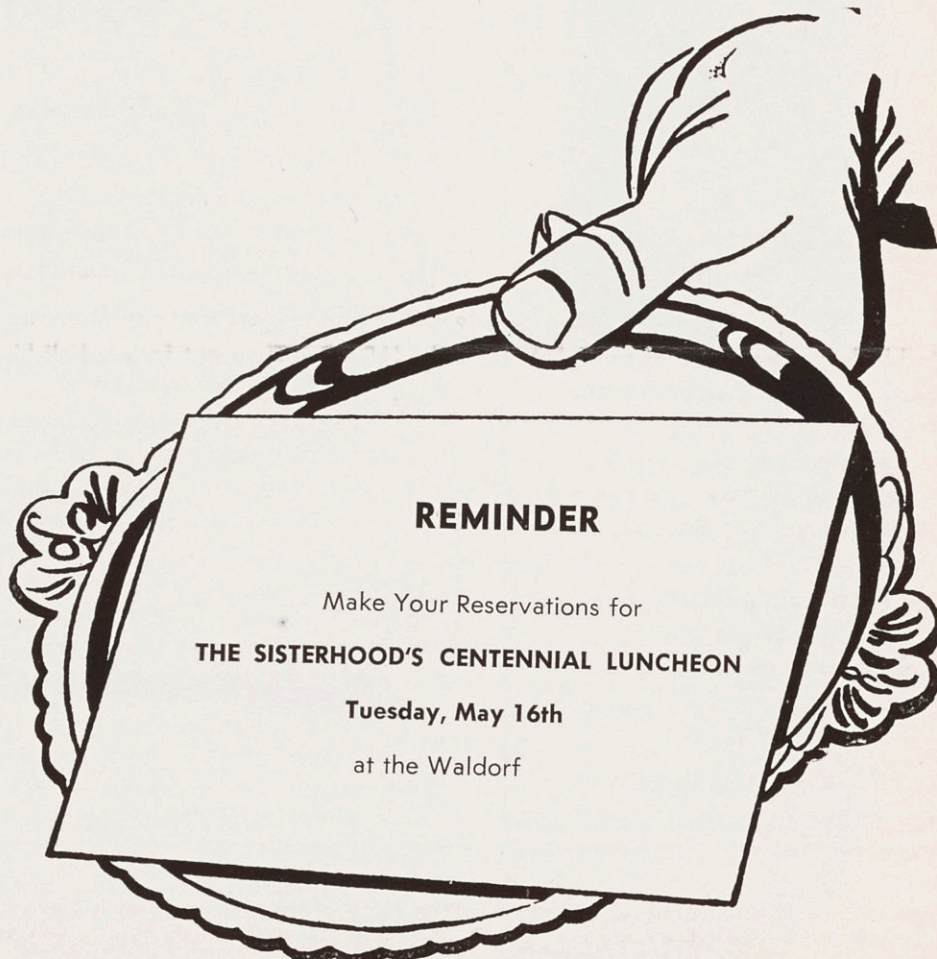

AN APPEAL TO THE WORLD JEWISH COMMUNITY

(The following appeal was transmitted on the phone from Moscow to a member of the Kehilath Jeshurun family. It will be reproduced all over the country in advance of National Solidarity Day, April 30th. The appeal was signed by 299 Jews from Moscow, Leningrad, Kishinev, Riga, Vilna, Minsk and other Soviet cities. H.L.)

The Jews of the U.S.S.R. have begun their fight of repatriation which will enable them to join their fellow Jews in Israel. There are many dramatic pages that have already been written in the history of this movement. There are today 35 prisoners in special security camps which symbolize this right of repatriation.

It is our feeling that sacrifices of this type as well as others were not in vain. Many Jews of the U.S.S.R. have reached a position of self-consciousness as Jews. It is a fact that thousands of Jews have already moved from the U.S.S.R. to Israel.

The Soviet authorities have gained some propaganda success in the public opinion of the West by letting a considerable number of Jews go to Israel in 1971. This propaganda success may be strengthened by similar numbers of Jews being allowed to go to Israel in 1972. The growth in the number of Jews desiring repatriation from the U.S.S.R. is by all means a remarkable phenomenon of our time.

At the same time, there is a sharp discrepancy between the number that are **allowed** to leave and the number of Jews in the U.S.S.R. who **wish** to leave for Israel. Today's speed of repatriation makes it impossible to satisfy the need of those people who wish to go now, let alone of all those Jews who will appeal later.

There is one more feature of the Soviet policy of repatriation which must be highlighted. The Soviet government has maintained a negative attitude towards the repatriation of specialists. This attitude as observed before is now displayed quite definitely and openly. The Soviet authorities have continually endeavored to block the departure of specialists from the U.S.S.R. They put forward all kinds of demands and excuses. They introduce new requirements. All who wish to leave for Israel are thrown out of their jobs.

People are thus deprived of an opportunity to start a new life. They are now deprived of jobs relating to their specialties. Deprived of the means of earning a living, these people are now in the dark about their future. They do not know when their senseless stay in this country will come to an end. It is imperative that all Jews who wish to migrate to Israel be given this human right, particularly those who have been waiting months and years for an answer.

I believe that the Jewish community of the United States and all other countries of the Western world will do their best to arrive at a just settlement of the problem of repatriation of Soviet Jews to Israel. We rely on your help. Shalom!

A Statement By Golda

The Prime Minister of the State of Israel, speaking at a plenary session of the recent World Zionist Congress, spoke movingly to those who challenge religion from the left and from the right. We quote below some of her words as they appeared in the overseas edition of the Jerusalem Post:

"There is no difference between Jewish religion and Jewish nationality; that is the ABC of our people. An American can be an Anglican-American or a Buddhist-American, but I have yet to meet an Anglican-Jew or a Buddhist-Jew."

Her reference was apparently to a recent decision of the Supreme Court of Israel to the effect that religion and nationality are inseparable.

Continuing, the Prime Minister said: "I am almost sure that without this identity between the Jewish faith and Jewish nationality the Jewish people would not have survived. But I am equally sure that our faith cannot survive without searching for new ways to meet the problems of the seventies." Addressing herself to the extremist view which has recently threatened to tear Israel apart, Mrs. Meir said: "The aim must be to learn to live together; with differences — but together; and the motto must be Ahavat Yisrael, love of Israel, love of even those Jews who do not keep all the mitzvot." This last remark brought thunderous applause from the entire assemblage — the religious participants as well as the non-religious ones.

Referring for the first time in public to the unfortunate demonstration against her by extremist Jews in New York outside of the Hotel Americana on December 12th, the Prime Minister said, poignantly: "The fact that gentile policemen had to protect the Prime Minister of Israel from youths with beards and sidelocks was a hilul hashem."
