## Golda Meir's *My Life*

Featured at Sisterhood Meeting

An illustrated slide book review of Golda Meir's stirring autobiography *My Life* will be the featured program at the Sisterhood meeting this Monday, January 21. The book reflects the dramatic story of Israel itself and its struggle to survive.

Gathered from many historic and archival sources, the slides tell the story of this remarkable woman as a pioneer, wife, mother, diplomat, Zionist and statesman. They trace her life from birth in Russia to her resignation as Prime Minister of Israel in 1974.

The presentation will be delivered by Mrs. Helen Grayson, noted lecturer and educator who has distinguished herself as an authority on Israel.

The meeting, beginning with a light lunch begins at 12:30 P.M. All women of the congregation are invited to bring their friends as guests of the Sisterhood.

## Yeshiva University to Establish Chair In Homiletics and Practical Rabbinics In Memory of Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein

Dr. Norman Lamm, President of Yeshiva University, announced the establishment of a Joseph H. Lookstein Chair in Homiletics and Practical Rabbinics at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary of Yeshiva University, effective September 1980. The announcement that the University would honor its distinguished alumnus, guide, teacher and benefactor was made at the Chanukah Dinner on December 9, 1979.

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein, responding for the congregation and for his family, expressed the gratitude of this community for this great tribute to our late Senior Rabbi. He informed the gathering that the Board of Trustees of the Congregation had pledged Kehilath Jeshurun to try to fund this Chair to as great an extent as possible. Our effort will be part of the century fund raising program of Yeshiva which for its 100th Anniversary in 1986 would like to raise the sum of \$100,000,000.

### A. Milton Brown Honored

Our esteemed Trustee and past Secretary, A. Milton Brown, was a guest of honor at this dinner. A large gathering of friends of the Browns from both K.J. and Ramaz paid tribute to him by their attendance that evening. Many of them also made generous contributions to the University in his honor. Mr. Brown, in his own behalf and in behalf of his wife Lillian, pledged \$25,000 as the first participant in the funding of the Joseph H. Lookstein Memorial Chair.

### Louise and Nathan Goldsmith Establish Facility at Cardozo Law School

We were very pleased to note that our distinguished Trustee, Nathan Goldsmith and his wife Louise dedicated a reading room at the Cardozo Law School of Yeshiva with a pledge of \$100,000. This, too, will be part of our effort for the funding of the Chair in memory of the Senior Rabbi.

During the course of the evening more than \$185,000 was pledged by members of the congregation to help the University with its work and to participate in the \$100,000,000 century fund raising plan.

We are also pleased to note that a member of the congregation whose primary home is at the Fifth Avenue Synagogue, Ira Rennert, was also a guest of honor at this dinner. Ira and his wife Inge pledged \$20,000 for Yeshiva and they were the recipients of many good wishes from their friends both at Fifth Avenue and K.J. who came to join in the tribute to them. Inge herself was personally involved in providing for the beautiful decor that evening.

All in all, the Yeshiva University Chanukah Dinner was a great event for our community. We hope that the congregation will continue to render dedicated support to Yeshiva in the years ahead.

## Dates Set for Congregation and Ramaz Family for Torah Writing in Memory of Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein

Milton Berkowitz and Irwin Shapiro, Co-Chairmen of the Torah Writing Project, together with Hon. Jerome Hornbluss, Co-ordinator, have announced the dates of individual sessions in which members of the K.J. and Ramaz family will be able to participate in the writing of an *os* in the Torah which is being written in memory of Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein. At each session groups of people, composed of families or friends, will be invited to the center *bimah* to participate symbolically in the writing of one *os*. There will be special programs at each of the occasions in order to give significance to the *mitzvah* and to the association of the Torah with the memory of our Senior Rabbi, the Founder and first Principal of Ramaz.

Invitations will be sent to all the members of the Congregation, the parents of Ramaz students and the alumni informing them about further details.

## Davening and Learning, Teen Style

A yeshiva education ideally consists of doing as well as learning. The lessons of yesterday serve as the basis for the actions of today and tomorrow. The sense of purpose and commitment exuded by the core-group's total involvement in the leading of services, group singing, reading of the Torah, sharing words of Torah and participating in a class highlighting the values inherent in Jewish prayer have been most gratifying.

Rabbi Jack Bieler of the faculty of the Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein Upper School of Ramaz teaches the shiur following services which begin at 9:30 A.M.
