Inauguration of Annual Memorial to Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held this year on Tuesday evening, May 12. We will have the privilege at that meeting of inducting more than 50 families into the membership of Kehilath Jeshurun. We will elect Officers and Trustees and honor members who are observing important anniversaries of their affiliation with the Synagogue. We will remember those of our Congregational family who were called to their eternal reward during the past year and conduct some important items of business for Kehilath Jeshurun.

Memorial to the late Senior Rabbi

While all of the above will be important, the highlight of the meeting will be the inauguration of an annual memorial to Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein which the Officers and Board of the Congregation have decided should be a regular feature at this meeting which the late Rabbi Lookstein first developed and in which he took so much pride. Each year we will ask one member of the Congregation to deliver a memorial tribute to our beloved Senior Rabbi who touched the hearts of so many of us but whose contributions to the Congregation and Ramaz might otherwise dim with the passing of years.

We have chosen for the first memorial tribute an Associate Trustee of the Congregation, Steven Gross. Mr. Gross, a practicing attorney, is a graduate of Ramaz, Columbia College and Columbia Law School. He grew up in Kehilath Jeshurun and, like many of us, he saw in the late Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein a second father. We are certain that his tribute will move us all and remind those of us who didn't know the Senior Rabbi why it is that those who did know him hold his memory in such reverence.

A cordial invitation is extended to the entire membership of the Congregation to attend the 109th meeting. Please inform us of your expected attendance so that we may prepare adequately for the collation which will follow the formal proceedings.

EDITORIAL ON
YOSEF MENDELEVICH**

On February 26 of this year, just one week after the arrival of Yosef Mendelevich, the Prisoner of Zion, in Israel, the Jerusalem Post reacted editorially to a brutal attack on the part of Charlie Biton, a member of the Knesset, who assaulted Mendelevich verbally in a Knesset Committee. The Communist Party member of the Knesset criticized what he called the "Mendelevich festival" and he accused the Prisoner of Zion of having come to Israel "to get your free apartment and your tax-free car."

Mendelevich maintained his composure in the face of this uncalled for and unexpected attack and, when asked by the television interviewer who was present at the time what he thought about what had happened, answered: "It is laughable; the man must be sick; he should go and visit the Soviet Union for a few weeks and then he would return to Israel but no longer a Communist." The Jerusalem Post sharply criticized Charlie Biton for his disgraceful behavior. The paper, however, added the following paragraph which drew a response from our Rabbi:

"At the same time, a word or two must be said on the other side of the argument. Regrettably, Mr. Mendelevich, a brave and honest man, has allowed himself from the moment of his arrival to be taken for a ride by an assortment of radical, religious groups, from the anti-nationalists to the rabidly rightist."

The Rabbi responded with a letter which was printed in both the Israel and International editions of the Jerusalem Post. We are pleased to present herewith a copy of that response.

A BRAVE AND PIOUS MAN

To the Editor of The Jerusalem Post

SIR: — In your justifiably critical editorial of February 26 on the brutal verbal assault of MK Biton upon Yosef Mendelevich in a Knesset committee, you "even-handedly" criticized the victim himself for having "allowed himself to be taken for a ride by an assortment of radical, religious groups..." In so doing, you have misread the nature of a brave and deeply pious man.

The only ride on which Mendelevich allowed himself to be taken was a car ride from Ben Gurion Airport to the Western Wall. Even that ride was interrupted by him for a walk in the rain up the final hill to Jerusalem in order to experience *aliya laregel*.

Yosef Mendelevich is not a captive of any person or any group of persons. He has demonstrated heroic independence for almost 11 years in the harsh climate of Soviet prisons by practising his faith and by

teaching his fellow prisoners the Hebrew language, Jewish history and the *Mitzvot* of the Torah.

Similarly, he maintains a uniquely Jewish heroic posture here in Israel by his innate modesty and humility. When I had the privilege of spending half an hour with him in his sister's tiny and bare kitchen in Alon Shvut and I suggested to him that myriads of Jews view him as a heroic personality, he winced at my words and insisted that he was no hero — he was a simple man.

Even his restrained reaction to MK Biton's shocking insults was a manifestation of the religious requirement of the Talmud that "a hero is one who controls himself."

Mendelevich deserves more than even-handed criticism. He merits our gratitude, our praise and our emulation.
