PRISONER WITHOUT A NAME, CELL WITHOUT A NUMBER

Prisoner Without A Name, Cell Without A Number, Jacobo Timerman's writings of his imprisonment and torture in Argentina in the late 1970's is the second book to be discussed this year by the AM HASEFER Book Reading Club.

Timerman, the editor of a leading Buenos Aires newspaper was kidnapped and detained by the Argentine Military for several years. He associates this with his being Jewish and an outspoken supporter of Israel. To some, his memoir is an unforgettable testament to courage and integrity. To others, it is a self-serving defense of a left leaning political commentator.

"NURSING HOME WITHOUT WALLS" — NEW COMMUNITY SERVICE AT THE JEWISH HOME AND HOSPITAL FOR AGED

The Upper West Side of Manhattan now has a program to which sick, elderly people can turn for long term health care — in their own homes. Central House of the Jewish Home and Hospital for Aged on 106th Street was recently certified by the State of New York to implement a program for homebound elderly who need continuing health care.

Under enabling legislation known as "The Nursing Home Without Walls," The Jewish Home's program provides all traditional nursing home services in the patient's home.

These services include nursing and medical social work help, treatments by licensed therapists for physical and occupational therapy, home health aides, personal care workers, homemakers, medical supplies and equipment.

Eligibility is limited to those who meet State criteria for care at skilled nursing or health related levels. Patients must live in the area which extends from 59th Street to the northern Manhattan boundary, west of Central Park, Morningside Avenue and St. Nicholas Avenue.
