SOLIDARITY SUNDAY FOR SOVIET JEWRY CHAIRD BY RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN

We are proud that Rabbi Haskel Lookstein is again serving as chairman of Solidarity Sunday for Soviet Jewry. We will, however, feel an even greater sense of pride when we witness a massive turnout of adults and children alike from the Kehilath Jeshurun/Ramaz community marching, chanting and listening in solidarity in behalf of our brethren in the Soviet Union. Every man, woman and child should feel it his or her personal obligation to be present that day demonstrating his and her understanding of the needs of Soviet Jews and, particularly, the plight of those who have been refused visas or who are now in prison.

The Soviet government and Soviet Jews will be watching to see what kind of reaction American Jews have to the severe drop in emigration. The most important barometer for that reaction is Solidarity Sunday. Everyone who comes will have a share in demonstrating that we care. We need everyone.

IF OUR VOICES DIE, SO DO THEIR HOPES.

AN URGENT CALL TO WORLD JEWRY

We, the representatives of the major national and international Jewish organizations throughout the world, constituting the Presidium of the Brussels Conference on behalf of Soviet Jewry, assembled in Washington, D.C., Jan. 26-28, 1982, solemnly declare our solidarity with our Jewish brethren in the Soviet Union. We want them to know that we are at one with them, totally identified with their struggle for asserting their national identity and for their right to leave the Soviet Union, and to return to their homeland, Israel.

Profoundly concerned for their fate, we denounce the policy pursued by the government of the Soviet Union in suppressing the Jewish cultural and religious heritage. This constitutes a flagrant violation of human rights incorporated in international treaties ratified by the Soviet Union as well as by the Soviet constitution.

The exodus of Jews from the Soviet Union has effectively been halted. From an average of over 4,000 a month in 1979, it has now declined to a mere trickle.

Repression of Jews has intensified, and severe sentences of imprisonment and exile meted out to activists on false charges. Constant intimidation has been applied to stop the teaching of the Hebrew language and culture. Harassment of Hebrew classes, confiscation of Hebrew books are an increasingly frequent occurrence. The practice of Judaism is subjected to special disabilities.

SOLIDARITY SUNDAY FOR SOVIET JEWRY MAY 2nd

WHY DO SOVIET JEWS NEED OUR HELP NOW?

- * Jewish emigration from the Soviet Union has come to a standstill. 500,000 Soviet Jews who have already expressed a desire to emigrate are now in limbo.
- * Teachers of Jewish culture and tradition have been threatened with arrest, their homes have been raided and their teaching materials confiscated.
- * Soviet Jews are surrounded by an atmosphere of hate, and subjected to continuing virulent anti-Semitic propaganda in the Soviet media.
- * Soviet Jews are denied access to universities and to professional employment opportunities.
- * Every Jew who applies to emigrate risks the possibility of arrest. At present, 19 Jews are languishing in Soviet jails because of their desire to emigrate to their homeland, Israel.

WHAT IS SOLIDARITY SUNDAY FOR SOVIET JEWRY?

- * Solidarity Sunday is an annual march and rally for Soviet Jewry, beginning at 12 noon, on May 2nd, from 56th Street and 6th Avenue and ending at Dag Hammarskjold Plaza (47th Street and 1st Avenue, opposite the United Nations).

- * Solidarity Sunday is the largest event of its kind in the world, annually attracting over 150,000 people.

WHO PARTICIPATES?

- * People from all walks of life. On this day, stage personalities, political and religious leaders, Jews and non-Jews, organizations and individuals and people of all ages join forces on behalf of Soviet Jewry.
- * Participants from the entire metropolitan area and from as far as Boston, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C. attend this massive demonstration of unity with our Soviet brethren.

HOW DOES SOLIDARITY SUNDAY HELP?

- * Since the first Solidarity Sunday eleven years ago, more than 260,000 Soviet Jews have left the Soviet Union and now live in freedom.
- * Because of our protests in 1971, two Soviet Jewish prisoners of conscience had death sentences commuted. Since 1979, eight prisoners of conscience have been released before the ends of their terms and allowed to emigrate to Israel.
- * Over the past decade, our actions have had a significant impact on U.S. Administrations, Soviet policy and particularly on the morale of Soviet Jews.

WHY IS SOLIDARITY SUNDAY 1982 PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT?

- * In 1981 the number of Jews permitted to leave declined to the lowest point in the past 10 years. Emigration figures for the beginning of this year indicate that the numbers may be reduced even further.
- * Soviet Jews, the Kremlin and the White House await our response to this crisis. We must send them the strongest freedom message ever.

WHO SPONSORS SOLIDARITY SUNDAY FOR SOVIET JEWRY?

- * Solidarity Sunday is sponsored by the Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry, in cooperation with its 85 constituent organizations and community groups.

HOW CAN YOU ENSURE A SUCCESSFUL SOLIDARITY SUNDAY?

- * Marching with your family and friends and the entire Kehilath Jeshurun - Ramaz community.

Over the past two years the number of refuseniks, many of whom have been waiting years for exit permits, has more than doubled and their plight worsened.

These adverse developments take place in an environment saturated by government sponsored virulent anti-Semitic propaganda and overt discriminatory policies against

Jews in higher education and employment.

The Jewish people will not remain silent. The conscience of the civilized world must be aroused. This Presidium calls upon Jewish communities and organizations throughout the world to raise their voices against the oppression of their brethren in the Soviet

Union. We, also, appeal to all people of goodwill to join with us in this great, moral and humanitarian struggle for the rights of Soviet Jews.

IN RESPONSE TO THE DESPERATE CRY OF SOVIET JEWS, THIS PRESIDIUM HEREWITH ISSUES AN URGENT CALL FOR THE CONVOCAION OF A WORLD CONFERENCE OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE — BRUSSELS III. The collective voice of Jewry at this conference will proclaim its demand that the Soviet authorities forthwith open the gates to those Jews who seek to return to their homeland; to release the Prisoners of Zion; to cease harassment of the Jewish people; to halt the assault upon Jewish culture and religion; and to cease anti-Jewish discriminatory policies and practices.

Brussels III shall demonstrate our unflinching determination to participate in the fulfillment of the aspirations of Soviet Jewry. In this struggle, we are confident of the support of all people who cherish peace and freedom, and who will join us in our humanitarian demand: LET MY PEOPLE GO!
