YOM HASHOA — HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY

**SERVICES AND PROGRAM TO BE HELD
WEDNESDAY EVENING, APRIL 17, at 7:30 P.M.**

The observance of Yom HaShoa — Holocaust Remembrance Day has, in recent years, gained considerable recognition as an important date on the Jewish calendar. In communities throughout the world and especially in Israel and America congregations, schools and other organizations and institutions have marked this day with seriousness and commitment. We are proud that Kehilath Jeshurun has been in the forefront of this effort as more than 500 people now gather in our Main Synagogue each year.

The Yom HaShoa program at KJ traditionally begins with a memorial candle lighting ceremony in memory of the six million Jews who perished during the Holocaust. This year, we will once again ask members of our congregation who are survivors of the Holocaust as well as the adult children of survivors and young children of survivors to light these memorial candles. It is important, however, for us to realize that the Yom HaShoa service and program is not intended only for the direct survivors of the Holocaust. Each of us who lives today is a survivor and we, as a people, are responsible for one another. It is incumbent upon each Jew to observe Yom HaShoa and we, therefore, urge all in our community to join with us on Wednesday evening, April 17 at 7:30 P.M.

The program itself will include readings from Holocaust literature, special memorial prayers and appropriate choral selections performed by the Ramaz Lower School Chorus under the direction of Carroll Goldberg.

We are the mourners of those who died in sanctification of God's name. Please join us in marking the Yahrzeit of the six million men, women and children — our brethren.

113th ANNUAL MEETING TO INDUCT FIFTY NEW MEMBERS MEMORIAL TRIBUTE TO RABBI JOSEPH H. LOOKSTEIN TO BE DELIVERED BY LAWRENCE KOBRIN WEDNESDAY EVENING, MAY 1, AT 8:00 P.M.

The 113th annual meeting of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun will be held this year on Wednesday evening, May 1 at 8:00 PM. Included in the evening will be a reflection on the continuing active role that KJ plays in the life of this community which it has been serving since its founding here in 1872.

Kehilath Jeshurun has the privilege this year of inducting more than fifty new families into membership, continuing a pattern of growth that we have now enjoyed for several years. New trustees will be elected, new associate trustees will be appointed and a tribute will be paid to those retiring from the Board.

We are pleased to note that there will be a spectacular number of members who will be observing important anniversaries of their affiliation with the synagogue and will so be honored. At the same time, the assemblage will take the opportunity to memorialize those of our Congregational family who were called to their eternal reward during the past year.

The Sixth Annual Memorial to Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein will be delivered this year by Lawrence Kobrin. A man who grew up in our congregation, Larry attended Ramaz, has, along with his wife Ruth, seen their daughters Debra and Rebecca and their son Jeffrey attend the school, and served as Chairman of its Board of Trustees. The Kobrins are a family of three generations in our congregation. We are certain that the tribute will move each of us who knew and loved the late Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein and will be interesting and informative to all who have joined the KJ family since his passing in 1979.

**JESSE JACKSON
AN ANTI-SEMITES?**

Syndicated columnist Tom Braden writes in the *Washington Times* (Mar. 20) that Jesse Jackson has nothing good to say about Israel's rescue of black Ethiopian Jews. Braden says that he recently asked Jackson: "Do you find it appropriate to say something in praise of Israel's rescue of starving black Jews in Ethiopia?" Jackson responded in part that it was "a military mission even though it had humanitarian goals."

Braden was shocked by Jackson's response. "What did he mean by 'military mission'? That Israel's air force took part in the effort to rescue the starving? What possible difference does that make? From the humanitarian standpoint, what better use for military planes? And why impugn the motives of those who are engaged in a humanitarian act unless, out of prejudice, you don't want to recognize the humanitarianism."

Braden, who says that he has long admired Jackson, concludes by saying that "in addition to being a graceful figure, a powerful speaker, and a political leader, Jesse Jackson is an anti-Semite."

For the Jews of the Soviet Union, 1984 was a most dismal and discouraging year. There was further closing of the gates of emigration and Prisoners of Conscience languishing in Soviet prisons and labor camps.

IN ALL OF 1984, ONLY 896 JEWS WERE PERMITTED TO LEAVE THE SOVIET UNION. LAST MONTH, 97 JEWS WERE PERMITTED TO LEAVE.

The Soviets have not only brought a halt to emigration they have also made every step in the long visa application process even more frustrating and more difficult.

Not only are fewer Jews being permitted to emigrate, but because of such bureaucratic obstacles and because would be emigrants are increasingly subjected to harassment and economic pressures, fewer and fewer Jews are prepared to even risk applying to emigrate.

The Soviet Jewish emigration movement sparked a revival of Jewish pride and culture in the USSR based on the hope of returning to the Jewish homeland. If the possibility of emigration is no longer a conceivable hope for them then the Jewish cultural renaissance may fade away too. WE CANNOT PERMIT THAT

TO HAPPEN TO OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN THE SOVIET UNION!

Every man, woman and child should feel that it is his or her personal obligation to be present at SOLIDARITY SUNDAY ON MAY 5 demonstrating his and her understanding of the needs of Soviet Jews and particularly the plight of those who have been refused visas and who are now in prison.

The Soviet Government and Soviet Jews will be watching to see what kind of reaction American Jews have to the continuing drop in emigration. The most important barometer for that reaction is Solidarity Sunday. Everyone who comes will have a share in demonstrating that we care. We need everyone. We need you!

ISRAEL VIA SATELLITE

In a radio first, WMCA Radio broadcasts "LIVE FROM ISRAEL" linking New York to Israel via satellite on a weekly basis.

The hour-long, live program is broadcast every Monday from 4 to 5 PM over WMCA, 570 AM. Barry Farber hosts the program from WMCA's New York studios with Shelia Zucker from the studios of Kol Israel in Tel Aviv.

New Yorkers can now speak directly to newsmakers in Israel about political and economic issues, entertainment and lifestyle.

WMCA calls the new program "an exciting event in radio broadcasting — one that will enlighten all listeners on current, vital issues of concern to Americans and Israelis both."

Outstanding guests who have appeared recently on the show include Jerusalem's Mayor, Teddy Kollek; Eliezer Shmueli, Director General of the Education Ministry; and Yaacob Kirshen, Israel's most famous political cartoonist for the *Jerusalem Post*.

UJA TO SPONSOR SUMMER MISSION FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS

Under the leadership of the University Programs Department of the UJA, there will be a two week summer mission of 35 to 40 college age students to Poland and Israel this summer. Participants will have an opportunity to examine the work of the Joint Distribution Committee and will meet with community leaders. The aim is to expose the students to the roots of the most significant Jewish experience of modern times: the destruction of European Jewry and the revitalization of World Jewry through the birth of the State of Israel.

In addition, the sponsoring leaders of the mission will work in depth on campaign education and leadership development.

The mission will explore the remnants of the communities of Warsaw and Krakow and will conduct memorial and study visits to Auschwitz and Birkenau.

While in Israel, the mission will visit olim from Ethiopia, meet with students in youth aliyah villages, visit an army base in the Golan Heights, learn about kibbutz life and spend time with families on a kibbutz, and participate in other interesting sightseeing activities.

The program will take place from June 16 to June 30. Those wishing to participate should call Rabbi Lookstein for further information.

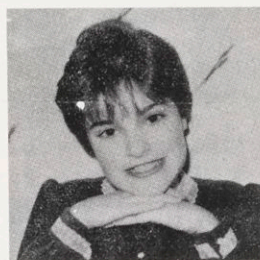
