Shabbat Dinner to be held Friday Evening

The seventh annual Scholar In Residence Shabbat and Friday evening dinner will be held on the weekend of November 8 and 9. An outstanding faculty has been invited to address the congregation on the theme: THE ZIONISM IS RACISM RESOLUTION — ON ITS 10TH ANNIVERSARY.

FRIDAY EVENING

Following Kabbalat Shabbat services and the Friday evening Shabbat dinner, Malcolm Hoenlein will speak on the topic: THE RESOLUTION'S IMPACT ON AMERICAN JEWS: FROM FARRAKHAN TO FOREIGN POLICY. Mr. Hoenlein who has been a well received guest at KJ on a number of occasions in the past is the Executive Director of the Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater New York, the central coordinating agency for all major Jewish organizations in the Metropolitan New York area. He previously served as the founding Executive Director of the Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry. A graduate of Temple University, Mr. Hoenlein completed his graduate studies at the University of Pennsylvania's Department of International Relations where he also taught International Relations. He served as the Middle East Specialist at the Foreign Policy Research Institute and has been a consultant to many public officials and civic and communal agencies.

SATURDAY MORNING

On Saturday morning, Ambassador Binyamin Netanyahu will speak from the pulpit during Shabbat morning services on the subject: WHERE THE WORLD STANDS NOW.

Following two years of service as Deputy Chief of Mission at the Embassy of Israel in Washington, Ambassador Netanyahu was appointed Permanent Representative of Israel to the United Nations in September, 1984. An accomplished author, businessman, and soldier, Mr. Netanyahu went to college and completed his graduate studies at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He served as Executive Director of the Jonathan Institute, a Jerusalem research foundation on terrorism and organized two international conferences on the subject in Jerusalem and in Washington.

ANNUAL BLOOD DRIVE TURNS INTO HEALTH FAIR DAY TEFILLIN AND MEZUZAH CHECK TO ALSO TAKE PLACE SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 17

The tenth annual Kehilath Jeshurun Blood Drive sponsored by the KJ Men's Club and Ramaz Parents Council will be held in the Synagogue Social Hall on Sunday morning, November 17, from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM. In honor of this special anniversary, the committee headed by Jerry Berkowitz, Barbara Arfa and Dr. Robert April has turned the day into a full scale health fair.

In addition to the blood collection, other events will include:

- * Periodic talks by a professional nutritionist from Lenox Hill Hospital who will have information about appetizing, kosher, low fat/low sodium diets.
- * Blood pressure determination available to anyone who wants to be tested.
- * American Heart Association films on CPR and Cardiac Emergencies.
- * A registration desk for our next CPR Education course to be given at KJ this coming January.

We will again have a *sofer* present for tefillin and mezuzah checks to make sure that our spiritual health is also in good order. See more about that on page 2.

As we did last year, Tay-Sachs testing will be available for those blood donors who wish to be tested. A nominal fee will be charged for that service only. Specific testing for viral and other

infectious agents as mandated by law will be done for all donors.

Those who participated in previous years have set an example for our Synagogue, our School and our community, as donors felt rewarded in fulfilling an act of *Pikuach Nefesh*. We are, once again, pleased to remind our readers that the entire congregational and school family, including members, staff, parents, students and their immediate families are covered by the Blood Bank.

From the point of view of good citizenship, from the point of view of Jewish Law, and from the point of view of community solidarity, a donation of blood on Sunday, November 17, represents an important *mitzvah*, obligation and privilege. We hope that everyone who can give, will give!

IS YOUR MEZUZAH KOSHER? Find Out Sunday, November 17

The Fourth Annual Kehilath Jeshurun Mezuzah Check will take place on Sunday, November 17. It will run concurrently with the blood drive, from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM. Both an educational display and certified *sofrim* (scribes) will be available.

The mitzvah of placing a kosher mezuzah on the doors of our homes is derived from one of the biblical verses contained in the "Sh'ma." In order to ascertain that a mezuzah has retained its original quality of writing, the script must be checked at least twice in seven years. However, should something occur that might suggest a deterioration of the script (such as painting the doorframes without first removing the mezuzot), an inspection should be done as soon as possible.

An analysis of whether the mezuzah is or is not kosher and whether it can be repaired or needs to be replaced takes the sofar about 10-15 minutes. Of course, should a mezuzah need to be repaired, then the time is considerably longer. In order to prepare for the examination of your mezuzot, at the nominal charge of \$1.00 each, remove them from the doors and bring them, still in their cases, to KJ on Sunday morning.

An audio visual presentation of the laws, requirements and potential problems affecting mezuzot will be shown in the lobby throughout the morning. It will be a wonderful way to learn and to teach our children about this very special mitzvah.

ZIONISM AND RACISM

On November 10, 1975, the General Assembly of the United Nations passed an Arab inspired resolution defining Zionism as "a form of racial discrimination" by a vote of 72 - 35 with 32 abstentions. The vote was immediately denounced by Israel, the United States and France among other nations. On November 11 the Assembly's president, Gaston Thorn of Luxembourg, asserted that the resolution had destroyed a climate of conciliation which had developed at the UN.

Israeli Ambassador Chaim Herzog charged immediately before the vote that the UN was becoming "the world center of anti-Semitism." The issue was "not Israel or Zionism," he said, but rather, "the continued existence of this organization, which has been dragged to its lowest point of discredit by a coalition of despots and racists." It was fitting that the vote should come on November 10. "This was the night - on November 10, 1938 - when Hitler's Nazi storm troopers launched a coordinated attack on the Jewish community in Germany, burned the synagogues in all its cities, destroyed Jewish holy books and attacked Jewish homes." This was Kristallnacht!

Denouncing the resolution after its passage, US Ambassador Daniel P. Moynihan declared that the US "does not acknowledge, it will not abide by, it will never acquiesce in this infamous act." On November 11, the Senate unanimously adopted a resolution condemning the UN vote, and on the same day the House of Representatives unanimously adopted a similar resolution. Perhaps the most poignant comment came from the late Representative Benjamin S. Rosenthal (Dem. NY) who said: "Hitler would have been proud of those 72 delegates who voted last night against Zionism."

An editorial written by Marie Syrkin, and appearing in the December 1975 edition of *Midstream* magazine, rings true even today. "The resurgent anti-Semitism now raging at the United Nations is the symptom of an old malady. It is racism in its most virulent form. If not contained, it will destroy the United Nations and once more infect the globe. . . . Those who uphold Zionism defend the principles of a rational world order with equal rights for all people, the Jewish people among them."

... AND FOR THE MAGNIFICENT DECORATING

Our deep gratitude goes to Ady Trautman, Chairwoman and Dr. Ted Goldstein, Co-Chairman along with the wonderful members of their large committee who worked to the wee hours and who decorated our Sukkah on the Terrace. It was done in record time following the departure of Hurricane Gloria.

The entire committee did a superb job while performing this important mitzvah. During the course of the week, meals and kiddush were served to close to 5,000 people.

And while we are at it, our thanks to Nellie and Louis Orwasher for donating all the challah and rolls that were used in the Sukkah for the festival meals.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SEUDAH SHLISHIT

Between *Mincha* (3:45 PM) and *Maariv* services on Saturday afternoon, Malcolm Hoenlein and Sandy Eisenstat will join together in a dialogue on the subject: *WE ARE OUR BROTHERS KEEPERS!* It will be a discussion of Jewish responsibility to the political process in the 1980's and will take place at a Seudah Shlishit.

Mr. Eisenstat, past President of Kehilath Jeshurun and Vice Chairman of the Board of Ramaz School, served as National Chairman of the Orthodox Union's Political Action Advisory Council and is a member of the National Board of the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC). He is a New York attorney and has volunteered his advice to numerous United States Senators and Congressmen in support of Israel.

On this, the forty-seventh anniversary of Kristallnacht and the tenth anniversary of this low point in United Nation's history, our scholars in residence will examine the condition of Jews in America and of Israel in the world.

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FOCUS ON YOUTH

Ongei Shabbat

In the afternoon, from 3:30 to 5:00, two groups meet in the Synagogue House and provide a place for the children to socialize, play and learn together.
