RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN TO BE INSTALLED AS PRESIDENT OF THE NEW YORK BOARD OF RABBIS Sunday, February 9

Installation ceremonies for Rabbi Haskel Lookstein as new President of the New York Board of Rabbis will be held on Sunday afternoon, February 9, from 2-4 o'clock at the Sheraton Center Hotel, on 7th Avenue and 52nd Street. The occasion will mark a very significant milestone in the life of our Rabbi.

Jack D. Weiler, one of the leading Jewish philanthropists in the world, will be the installing officer in his capacity as Honorary Chairman of the Lay Advisory Board of the New York Board of Rabbis. Mr. Weiler is a very old friend of the Lookstein family and his interest in Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz has been manifested for many years in friendship and generosity. The Board of Rabbis Chaplaincy Services were named in honor of Jack Weiler on the occasion of his 80th birthday last year.

We have also just received word that the guest speaker at the installation will be New York State Attorney General, Robert Abrams. Another member of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun. Mr. Abrams is of course a close friend of the Lookstein family and very much involved in the life of KJ and Ramaz.

Invitations have been sent to the membership of the congregation. We ask that you respond directly to the New York Board of Rabbis so that they can plan accordingly. Those who would like to be invited but who may not have received official invitations can reserve a place by calling the synagogue office.

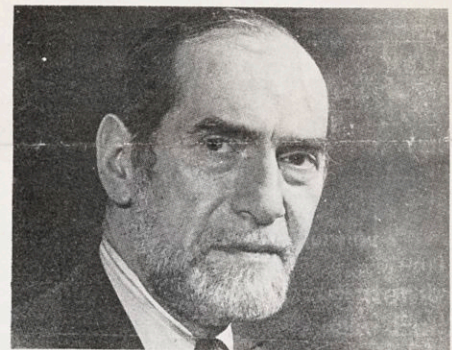
Should Orthodox Rabbis work with Conservative Rabbis and their institutions?

"Absolutely", says Rabbi Haskel Lookstein.

"Absolutely not", says Rabbi Joseph Grunblatt of Queens Jewish Center.

This difference of opinion is more than simply a polite disagreement among Orthodox leaders. According to some authorities, this speaks to the very survival of the American Jewish community.

GENETIC ENGINEERING: A PANACIA OR A PANDORA'S BOX? Couples Club to Sponsor Community Forum Tuesday, January 21, 8 PM

The Fourth Annual KJ Couples Club Forum will be held on Tuesday evening, January 21, at 8 PM. The topic, "GENETIC ENGINEERING", will be presented by a panel of experts who will discuss what genetic engineering is all about and what medical, legal and moral implications are inherent in gene therapy.

The evening, presented as a public service to the community, will be held in the Social Hall of the Synagogue House at 125 East 85 Street.

Dr. Yaakov Shechter, Professor of Genetics at Lehman College and the Graduate Center of the City University of New York, will moderate the evening. Dr. Shechter, who is Chairman of the Natural Sciences Core Curriculum at Lehman and also a Genetic Counselor at the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University, will present an easy to understand overview of what Genetic Engineering is all about.

Dr. Adam Bender, Associate Professor of Neurology at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine will discuss the medical implications of gene therapy. Dr. Bender, the Director of the Neuromuscular Clinic and Laboratory at Mt. Sinai, is a specialist in neuromuscular diseases, many of which are genetic in nature. Dr. Bender will discuss gene therapy, including the difficulties and future potential of this kind of treatment.

The legal implications of the topic will be presented by Dr. Alan J. Weisbard, Assistant Professor of Law at the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law of Yeshiva University. Professor Weisbard is also a visiting Assistant Professor in the Department of Epidemiology and Social Medicine at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He will discuss the law and government policy as it relates to genetic engineering. His insight, as former Assistant Director for Legal Studies on the President's commission for the Study of Ethical Problems in Medicine and Biomedical and Behavioral Research, will bring a unique perspective to our topic.

The moral issues surrounding the future of genetic engineering, especially as it relates to genetic changes passed on to future generations will be discussed by Rabbi Dale Polakoff. Rabbi Polakoff, Assistant Rabbi of Kehilath Jeshurun and a member of the faculty of the Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein Upper School of Ramaz is the founder of the Forum series.

We anticipate a stimulating and informative evening, which will include questions from the audience. Admission is free and refreshments will be served.

140 Jewish Genetics: Its Moral and Ethical Implications

7:30-8:20 PM

Dr. Yaakov Shechter

Underlying the scientific knowledge of Genetics is a vast complex of moral and ethical implications. In addition to providing a layman's understanding of genetic dangers and counseling, this course will analyze the moral and ethical dilemmas of modern technology in this very important area.

141 Biblical Narratives: A Methodology for Studying Biblical Stories

Numerous sections of the Bible can be understood in a new light by analyzing the stories that are contained within them. The entire book of Bereishit takes on a new light when viewed within the context of the competition between Yaakov and Essav. Similarly, it is difficult to understand the second book of Shmuel without understanding the story of David and Bat Sheva. Utilizing primary sources this course attempts to provide a framework for studying Biblical Stories.

142 The Jewish Life Cycle Revisited

This course will provide the beginner with tools for survival in the world of Jewish observance. By focusing on the Jewish life cycle — birth through death — an appreciation and understanding of laws, customs and beliefs will be attained.

We are proud to inform you of the possibility of attending at least one shiur every day of the week under the auspices of The Adult Institute of Continuing Jewish Education of Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz. No one in the community should pass up this wonderful opportunity. There are shiurim on various topics and at various levels so that everyone may feel comfortable in participating.

On Monday evening Rav Herschel Schachter, a Rosh Yeshiva at Yeshiva University and head of the Marcos and Adina Katz Kollel, presents an Advanced Talmud shiur in the Tractate Yevamot. The shiur is well attended by members of many different communities and is a unique chance to study Torah with one of the leading scholars of this generation.

On Tuesday at lunchtime, Rabbi Haskel Lookstein gives his Midtown Lunch and Talmud shiur in the Tractate Sanhedrin. Lunch is at 12 o'clock followed by a one hour shiur beginning at 12:30 at the office of David Sarna, 2 Grand Central Tower, 140 East 45th Street. For further information please contact the synagogue office.

Tuesday evening at 7:30 Rabbi Dale Polakoff presents a Talmud Shiur for Women. The shiur is studying the Tractate Kiddushin in detail and presents an opportunity for women to study Talmud in the traditional manner.

Wednesday evening at 8:30 Rabbi Polakoff presents a shiur on How To Learn Talmud. In addition to explaining the methodology of Talmudic study, Rabbi Polakoff and his class actually learn together various passages from the Talmud that utilize these methods.

On alternate Friday nights, Rabbi Moshe Rosenberg gives a Chumash shiur held in the homes of members in our community. The shiur is well attended, interesting and informative, and one of the best ways to spend a Friday evening.

Shabbat morning, Rabbi Moshe Rosenberg continues with a Talmud shiur studying the Tractate of Betzah. This shiur is intensive, making use of traditional sources and commentaries and always makes sure that Shabbat morning gets off to a good start.

Shabbat afternoon one hour before Mincha services Rabbi Haskel Lookstein gives a Talmud shiur in the Tractate Sanhedrin. Even when Shabbat afternoon is very short, this shiur is very popular among the members of our community.

And on Sunday morning following morning services, Dr. Gilbert N. Kahn gives a shiur in the Tractate Pesachim. This shiur uses the Steinsaltz edition of the Talmud in Hebrew, the Soncino edition in English and traditional commentaries.

What a wonderful way to spend your week attending a shiur of your choice from among those offered almost every day of the week. We look forward to your continued participation.

Among other matters, the dialogue promises to focus on the critical issues of conversion and acceptability for marriage. How should Orthodox Jews relate to people who converted to Judaism in Conservative institutions? Should we, as a large component of the Orthodox movement suggests, simply rule them out? Or, are other approaches possible? Does the experience of the Denver, Colorado Jewish community suggest that other approaches are doomed to failure? Or, should we try again through the New York Board of Rabbis, the Synagogue Council of America, or similar umbrella organizations?

As one measure of the extent of the schism in orthodox Judaism, Rabbi Lookstein has long been active in the New York Board of Rabbis of which he is now President, and Kehilath Jeshurun recently reaffirmed at its 113th Annual Meeting last May its support of the Synagogue Council of America. Rabbi Grunblatt, and many other orthodox rabbis, refused to join the New York

Board and discourage membership in the Synagogue Council.

The two participants in what promises to be a lively dialogue at the Sunday Supper are uniquely qualified to present their differing views in a spirited and articulate style. Rabbi Joseph Grunblatt, besides his Pulpit position in Queens, is a professor of Jewish Philosophy at Touro College. He is a member of the Executive Boards of the Orthodox Union, the Rabbinical Council of America and the vaad HaRabanim of Queens. He has been active with NCSY for many years as the former Chairman of Collegiate affairs for the Orthodox Union. He is well published and has lectured widely and is known to many listeners as a frequent participant in the popular radio program, "Taste of Torah".

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein is, of course, well known to the readers of this Bulletin as both the spiritual leader of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun and the principal of the Ramaz School. He is Joseph H. Lookstein Professor of Homiletics at Yeshiva University. A graduate of Columbia, Dr. Lookstein received his rabbinic ordination and his PhD from Yeshiva University. A past president of Yeshiva University Rabbinic Alumni, Rabbi Lookstein currently serves as the National Chairman of the Rabbinic Cabinet of UJA. He is the author of the newly published book, "Were We Our Brother's Keepers? — The Public Response of the American Jews to the Holocaust".

The Sunday Supper Dialogue has traditionally been a highlight during the synagogue's program year and we encourage members to make reservations now while space permits.
