Instructions For Children Saturday Night

Children from nursery age through grade 6 should assemble at the synagogue between 6:45 and 7:00 PM. Those of nursery age through grade 1 should meet in the Etra Chapel on the lobby level. Those in grades 2-6 should meet in the gym, one level down from the lower lobby. Teen age youth leaders and counselors who regularly supervise the youth activities program of the congregation will be in charge of the children that evening.

The children will be escorted to special sections reserved for them in the Main Synagogue. They will, of course, be provided with the traditional Purim graggers and, most important of all, sweets which are an integral part of the enjoyment of this lovely festival.

COPING WITH JEWISH LIFE TO BE FOCUS OF COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

Sunday evening, March 29

The Kehilath Jeshurun community will have a unique opportunity to look at Jewish life in a special evening at KJ on Sunday night, March 29.

The evening's program organized by the Men's Club will focus on the theme of "Coping with Jewish life." Three short radio plays will be offered, each to be followed by discussion moderated by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein. These radio plays will take a slice of real life from a Jewish family. The plays will present a situation and how some families might cope with it. The Rabbi will then review these solutions and solicit the views of attendees and how they might cope.

Be prepared for an evening of stimulating discussion. Among the topics on which we will focus:

- Your college age child brings home an unsuitable potential spouse. How will you react? What are your standards for your daughter's husband or your son's wife? How flexible can you be? How influential are parents at that time?

YOUR BONDS ARE DUE

Congregations throughout North America will join one another in an unprecedented program which is of special interest to the million Jews who purchased Israel bonds in 1972 and 1973, the year of the Yom Kippur war. If you are one of the million Jewish families who rallied behind Israel by purchasing Israel bonds during the 1973 emergency, Israel wants to say "thank you" by paying the full amount of interest as if the bonds were held to maturity—up to 22 months of advanced interest, provided you buy a new bond with a higher value.

Representatives of the bond organization will be at Kehilath Jeshurun on Purim eve, Saturday, March 14, from 7:00-10:00 PM, and on Purim day, Sunday, March 15, from 10:00-12:00 Noon, to help with the simple reinvestment procedure.

A bond professional will also provide information on the new high yielding securities available. A table will be set up in the lower lobby near the check room.

Remember, bonds bought in 1972 as well as 1973 are eligible for advance interest.

Please check your safe deposit box. Bring your 1972-1973 Israel bonds to our synagogue on Purim and reinvest in Israel's future.

PRICE OF MEMORIAL PLAQUES TO RISE NEXT SPRING

We are gratified by the number of new plaques that have been ordered and some already placed on the new memorial tablet on the western wall of the Main Synagogue.

The cost of a plaque on the memorial tablets has been \$500.00 for quite some time now. Inasmuch as we have limited space, the officers of the congregation have decided to increase the price for those plaques to \$650.00. That increase will not take place until May 1, 1987. Friday evening, March 20

In an impressive spirit of close cooperation, eight synagogues in the New York area will sponsor a special Friday evening dinner aimed at welcoming non-observant Jews to a traditional Sabbath experience. It will take place on Friday evening, March 20 at each of the congregations. As in previous years, the event will bring together people of all age groups, singles and families, young and old. Close to 1,500 people are expected to attend including about 200 at KJ.

The program begins with a welcome from Rabbi Lookstein, followed by a special Friday evening beginners' service with explanations in English. It will be led by Rabbis Dale Polakoff and Asher Berkowitz. A complete Shabbos dinner including songs, table discussions and Israeli dancing will follow.

The traditional dinner costs \$10.00 per person and \$20.00 per family including children. Reservations are required by Tuesday, March 17. No phone reservations may be accepted.

•The issue of surrogate motherhood has been changed by the case of Baby M. By March 29, that case may well have been decided, but the issue will still be faced by hundreds of families. How would you react to such a situation? What is the Jewish view of surrogate motherhood? Is it a viable alternative for couples who are unable to have their own children? What is the position of such a baby's Jewish life? For that matter, what is the baby's position in American life?

•Finally, "Coping with Jewish life" will explore the mundane but real influence of other forms of Judaism on our children. Does reform or conservative Judaism offer an opportunity for our children that orthodoxy does not? How will we cope if children are drawn to it? What would be the real impact of such an event on the parents' lives? Can we, or should we, correct what

The congregation is pleased to be able to bring this service to our community. The matzos come in one pound packages and are available at \$10.00 per pound. They may be picked up at the synagogue during the Kasher-In on Wednesday evening, April 8, between 7:00-9:00 PM.
