AMBASSADOR RONALD LAUDER TO SPEAK AT YOM HASHOAH SERVICE

"A Perspective on Kurt Waldheim and Austrian Anti-Semitism in the 1980's" Wednesday, April 13, 7:30 PM

The observance of Yom Hashoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day continues to occupy an increasingly central place on the calendar of American Jewry and particularly here in the KJ/Ramaz community. To help us observe this occasion, we have invited Ronald Lauder, former United States Ambassador to Austria, to give us: "A PERSPECTIVE ON KURT WALDHEIM AND AUSTRIAN ANTI-SEMITISM IN THE 1980'S"

Candlelighting Ceremony for Holocaust Survivors, Their Children and Grandchildren

The commemoration will begin with a candlelighting ceremony which will be led by survivors of the Holocaust, and children and grandchildren of survivors. Elsewhere in this Bulletin you will find a list of those who have already indicated they will be participating in this ceremony and the particular holocaust history of each family. 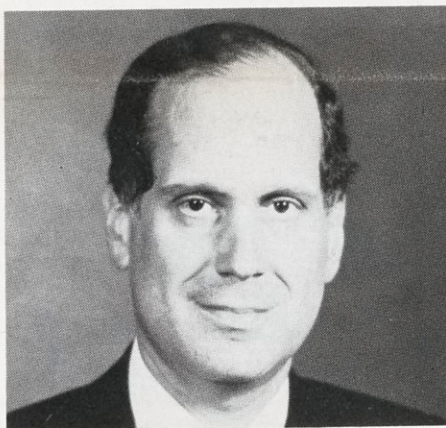
The program that evening will also feature choral presentations by the Ramaz Lower School chorus under the direction of Music Director, Jay Danzig. There will also be special readings and prayers.

Ambassador Lauder

Ronald S. Lauder was appointed by President Reagan as Ambassador to Austria in 1986. He brought to his diplomatic post a knowledge and experience in European affairs from his previous position as Deputy Secretary of Defense for European and NATO affairs as well as his own Austro-Hungarian heritage.

During his tenure as Ambassador, he forged strong diplomatic bonds between the United States and Austria while personally repudiating Austrian President Kurt Waldheim and warning the world of the rising tide of anti-semitism in Austria. Mr. Lauder has also responded to the needs of minorities and the Jewish communities

WOMEN'S TEFILLA GROUP TO BE ORGANIZED AT KJ First Service Shabbat Morning, April 30

We are pleased to announce that a women's tefilla group is being organized in our congregation and will meet for its first service on Shabbat morning, April 30, in the Max J. Etra Chapel. The service will be conducted according to guidelines accepted by about a dozen such groups around the country and approved, in our case, by Rabbi Lookstein.

What is a Women's Tefilla group?

A women's tefilla group is not a minyan. All of the special prayers like kaddish, kedusha and borchu which require a minyan are not said there. It is, essentially, a group of women who get together and recite publicly the prayers which they would be reciting privately if davening at home. In addition, the Torah is read by women. The Torah blessings are recited by each of the women who are called to aliyot. The only part of the blessing omitted is borchu.

The purpose of the service is to give women a more personal involvement in public prayer. The entire service is conducted by the women. There are no men present at all.

Plans for the Future

It is anticipated that the women's tefilla group will meet several times a year in our congregation. In that way there will be an opportunity for women to have this unique experience and yet still remain part of the total community on a regular Shabbat and Yom Tov basis.

The leaders of the women's tefilla group at KJ are Paula Bender, Carol Kaufman and Diana Bletter. The group extends a cordial invitation to all women who are interested to attend the first service on Shabbat morning, April 30, at 9:00 o'clock. Child care will be provided.

MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND RETREAT

Kehilath Jeshurun is proud to join with the New York Region of the Orthodox Union which will be holding its eighth annual Torah Retreat, Memorial Day Weekend, May 27-30, 1988, at the Homowack Lodge in Spring Glen, New York. The Retreat has come to be known as a weekend of outstanding symposia and shiurim given by a faculty of renowned rabbis.

This year's theme will be "KEDUSHAT AM YISRAEL — THE SANCTITY OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE." It will focus on such issues as conversion, marriage, divorce, and will touch upon such complex matters as patrilineal des-

cent, Ethiopian Jewry, and problems with *mamzeirut*. As might be expected, given these topics, we are proud to announce that Rabbi Lookstein will be serving on the faculty of this Retreat.
