ELIZABETH HOLTZMAN TO SPEAK AT YOM HASHOAH SERVICE

"Expelling Nazi War Criminals From the United States"
Monday, May 1, 7:30 PM in the Main Synagogue



The observance of Yom Hashoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, continues to occupy an increasingly central place on the calendar of American Jewry and particularly here in the KJ/Ramaz community. To help us observe this occasion, we have invited Brooklyn District Attorney, Elizabeth Holtzman to speak on: "EXPPELLING NAZI WAR CRIMINALS FROM THE UNITED STATES."

A former member of the House of Representatives, Ms. Holtzman served on the House Judiciary Committee. She won international recognition for her work against Nazi war criminals living in America. She was the first member of Congress to expose Government inaction against suspected Nazi war criminals. In 1979, she forced the Justice Department to create a special unit to investigate Nazis and wrote the law authorizing their deportation from the country.

Congresswoman Holtzman authored the amendment that is currently being used to bar Austrian president Kurt Waldheim from entering the United States and also to deport Nazi war criminals living in this country.

Candlelighting Ceremony for Holocaust Survivors, Their Children and Grandchildren

The commemoration will begin with a candlelighting ceremony which will be led by survivors of the Holocaust, and children and grandchildren of survivors. The program that evening will also feature choral presentation by the Ramaz Lower School Chorus under the direction of Music Director Jay Danzig. There will also be special readings and prayers.

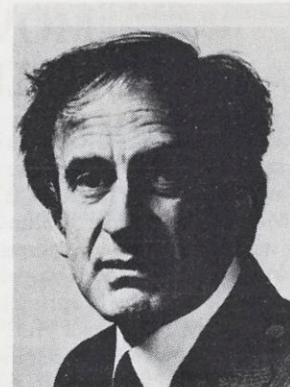
Elizabeth Holtzman

Elizabeth Holtzman is the youngest woman ever to be elected to the United States Congress. She served on the Judiciary Committee during the impeachment hearings on Richard Nixon. Since serving her four terms in Congress, Ms. Holtzman has twice been elected District Attorney of Brooklyn, the last time with 83% of the vote. A graduate of Radcliffe College, magna cum laude, she received her law degree from Harvard University.

ORGANIZATION OF EAST SIDE HATZOLAH MOVES AHEAD MORE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Twenty local residents recently began the training course to become volunteers for the East Side Hatzolah team. Hatzolah is an Emergency Medical Technician volunteer organization which responds to emergency medical calls. When a call is made to Hatzolah, these volunteers will be ready to spring into action, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

The volunteers are now meeting regularly in the training course and will be licensed as EMT's upon the course's completion in October. The classes, which meet on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings, run through October, with a summer break included.

More volunteers are still needed in order for the East Side Hatzolah to operate. The Upper East Side has a tremendous need for this service, but it cannot be viable without the manpower to serve as the medical technicians to answer the emergency calls.

The volunteers will all be equipped with two-way radios, connected to a central dispatch office. When someone in need on the East Side calls the Hatzolah emergency number, the call will be dispatched to all the

volunteers in the area. Those who are available will respond to the call with their own medical kits and equipment. At the same time, the local Hatzolah ambulance will respond to the same call, in case the patient should require transport to a nearby hospital. Unlike city ambulances, ("911"), Hatzolah ambulances will take a patient to any nearby hospital, not just those with whom New York City has contracted for emergencies.

The Upper East Side Hatzolah has the full support of all the orthodox synagogues in the area: The Fifth Avenue Synagogue, Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun, The Lisker Congregation, Congregation Orach Chaim, The Park East Synagogue, and The Yorkville Synagogue. CITY PLANNING COMMISSION REVISES CHANGES IN 86th STREET ZONING

Councilman Robert Dryfoos Helpful In Resolving Problem

We are very pleased to announce that the City Planning Commission, which had put forward plans for changing the zoning on East 86th Street which changes would have allowed "honky tonk" uses in the KJ/Ramaz neighborhood, has revised its proposed rezoning because of the efforts of Community Board 8, several block associations and, particularly, the representations made by the leadership of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz School.

The most active people in this effort have been Councilman Robert Dryfoos of our District who labored heroically to persuade the City Planning Commission of the inadvisability of making the changes it was planning; Steven Koppel, a member of our congregation and an alumnus of Ramaz, who served on the Community Board and who helped us through the city bureaucracy on this matter; and, of course, Arthur C. Silverman, Chairman of the Board of Ramaz and Benjamin Brown, President of the congregation. Rabbi Lookstein also played a major role in this effort in helping to bring out an attendance at a special meeting held last fall and in speaking persuasively at the meeting concerning the proposed changes.

The zoning changes proposed by the City Planning Commission, and which were recently approved by Community Board 8, will not in any way increase the kind of entertainment allowed in the 86th Street area. If anything, the ambience should even be better after the zoning changes go into effect.

We are grateful to the City Planning Commission for rethinking its plans on this matter and for being so open to the needs of our community in particular and the wider community in general. These discussions have been a marvelous case study in how a good city agency responds to the needs of the communities which it serves. In particular, we would like to commend Sylvia Deutsch, the Chairperson of the City Planning Commission, and Hedi White who is the Chairperson for Community Board 8, for all of their work.

THREE GRUSS KOLLEL LECTURES TO BE HELD IN MAY

Once again this year we will have the privilege of holding the Gruss Kollel lectures at Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun. Three lectures, given by Fellows of the Gruss Kollel Elyon of Yeshiva University will be held on three consecutive Shabbatot, May 6, 13 and 20.

The Gruss Kollel Elyon is an advanced institute for talmudic and rabbinic studies. Its benefactors, Joseph and the late Caroline Gruss, are well known to us as munificent benefactors and unequalled supporters of Jewish education on all levels.

The Gruss Kollel has been modeled after the famous Kollel of Rabbi Isaac Elchanan, spectator of Kovno, whose scholars formed the intellectual basis of talmudic leaders for that generation. The Gruss Fellows represent a broad spectrum of scholarships and learning experiences. From their ranks, it is hoped, will come authentic spiritual leadership for our people in this time and place.

The three scholars who will address the congregation are Rabbi David Horowitz, Rabbi Baruch Simon and Rabbi Avraham Bachrach. All three are graduates of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary of Yeshiva University. All three are currently on the faculty of Yeshiva University in one of its many departments.

Rabbi Horowitz is currently a Rosh Yeshiva in the Yeshiva Program of the undergraduate college. Rabbi Simon is a member of the Halakha faculty of the Isaac Breuer College of Hebrew Studies. Rabbi Bachrach is an instructor of Talmud at The Marsha Stern Talmudical Academy.

PASSAGE TO FREEDOM: 40,000 SOVIET JEWS TO EMIGRATE THIS YEAR

We did it. The Russians are coming. Some 40,000 Jews are expected to emigrate from the Soviet Union this year, the largest number in a decade. This influx marks a major victory for all the synagogues and organizations like Kehilath Jeshurun, The Coalition to Free Soviet Jews, The National Conference on Soviet Jewry, The Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry and UJA-Federation who have sponsored rallies, mounted exclusive letter-writing campaigns, organized visits with refuseniks in Russia and lobbied the U.S. and Soviet governments non-stop for release.

But now the arrival in Israel and New York of so many brings new challenges. These newcomers will require jobs, housing, medical care, food, clothing and Jewish education. It costs an average of \$5,500 including transportation from Russia, to resettle one person in the United States; more in Israel because of the need for new housing.

For 20 years, UJA-Federation has been the key source of funding for the absorption of Soviet Jews here and in Israel. Now additional funds must be raised to meet these emerging needs that will arise from the new exodus. Monies raised will enable 40,000 people to begin their new lives in Israel and America.

KOSHAROVSKYS FREED

We are most happy to announce that Yuli and Inna Kosharovsky, whose names and plight have graced our bulletin board in front of the Synagogue this past year have been freed and allowed to emigrate to Israel. We rejoice with them and hope that the Soviet Union will continue to allow more and more Jews and others to gain this basic human right of freedom.
