Kehilath Jeshurun will once again be the site of a spectacular Purim celebration for people of all ages. We particularly honor our children as special guests on this holiday.

Mincha services will begin at 5:50 PM. Young men of the congregation and students in the Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein Upper School of Ramaz will lead the Maariv service and read the Megillah.

Children from nursery age through grade 6 should arrive between 5:45 and 6:00 PM. Those of nursery age through grade 1 should meet in the Etra Chapel on the lobby level. Those in grades 2 through 6 should meet in the Gym, one level down from the lower lobby. Members of our Youth Department staff under the direction of Steve Felsenthal will be in charge of the children that evening.

The children will be escorted to special sections reserved for them in the Main Synagogue. They will, of course, be provided with Purim graggers and a bag of sweets to enhance their enjoyment of the great festival.

Parents are asked to join the regular service in the Main Synagogue until the conclusion, at which time they may pick up their children at the locations listed above.

PURIM PIZZA PARTY AND CHAGIGAH TO FOLLOW MEGILLAH

The annual Purim Pizza Party will be held in the New Auditorium following the Megillah reading. The hour long celebration will include a two piece band in the festive atmosphere and a menu of pizza, hamantaschen, soda and ice cream.

PURIM MORNING

On Purim morning, Thursday, March 19, we will read the Megillah twice at KJ. The first reading will be done by our Ritual Director, Rabbi Israel D. Bendelstein. It will be part of the regular morning service which will begin that day at 7:00 AM. Following the service, the congregation will be the guests of our Vice President, David Levy for a Purim breakfast with the traditional holiday fare.

The second reading is designed especially for women and children and others who may have missed the other reading. The second reading will take place at 10:30 AM on Thursday, while the second half of the crew of young people will read the Megillah. We especially urge women to attend this reading and, if they are blessed with children, to bring them along. This reading, graggers and all, will last approximately 45 minutes and everyone will enjoy it!

Following this later reading of the Megillah, a light collation of hamantaschen, milk, juice and coffee will be served. This religious and social experience also provides a time opportunity to exchange *Mishloach Manot*.

The Youth Department sponsored Purim carnival will then be held in the Gym and Social Hall from 11:30 AM to 2:30 PM.

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PASSOVER RELIEF — WE NEED YOUR GIFT NOW

The first order of priorities in preparing for Passover is Maot Chitim, Passover Relief. It is our way of saying that our personal joy on the festival is incomplete if we do not share what we have with others who are less fortunate.

Who gives to Passover Relief? According to the Shulchan Aruch (The Code of Jewish Law) there are only two types of people as far as Passover Relief is concerned: donors and recipients. If you are not a recipient you must be a donor.

The Kehilath Jeshurun Passover Relief Appeal serves first and foremost this communal mitzvah. Last year the readers of the Bulletin contributed more than \$35,000. It was a most gratifying response to a call for charitable funds. But, we need even more this year.

A large part of our funds go to the Joint Passover Appeal, which last year helped 16,134 individuals and 8,229 families, many of whom were sick and elderly.

There are additional causes which are helped generously by our appeal. They include among others:

- Gifts to needy individuals in our community.
- The New York Board of Rabbis Passover Fund for Jewish patients in hospitals and inmates in prisons.
- Many organizations and institutions who seek our help and depend on our assistance in this season and throughout the year.

KJ BEGINNERS PROGRAM TO HOLD PASSOVER SEDER

The new KJ Beginners program which has enjoyed a spectacular year of special activities including High Holy Day Services, weekly Shabbat morning services and a whole array of Monday evening beginners courses will now add a new dimension to its schedule.

Under the leadership of Rabbi Mark Dratch, KJ will host a service designed and planned as a learning experience for beginners. It is intended for those wishing to learn and understand more about the content and meaning of a seder and how to conduct it properly. This special seder will be held on the first night of Passover, Friday evening, April 17.

The cost will be \$55 per person.

We expect that the majority of the participants will be those who have been participating in our beginners services and classes and others who wish to increase their Jewish observance by attending such educational programs.

Reservations can be made by forwarding a check to the Synagogue Office listing the names of those planning to attend.

Due to the current economic climate in our city, the needs are greater and the number of people contributing may be fewer. Some donors of last year may be recipients this year. We need your extra effort.
