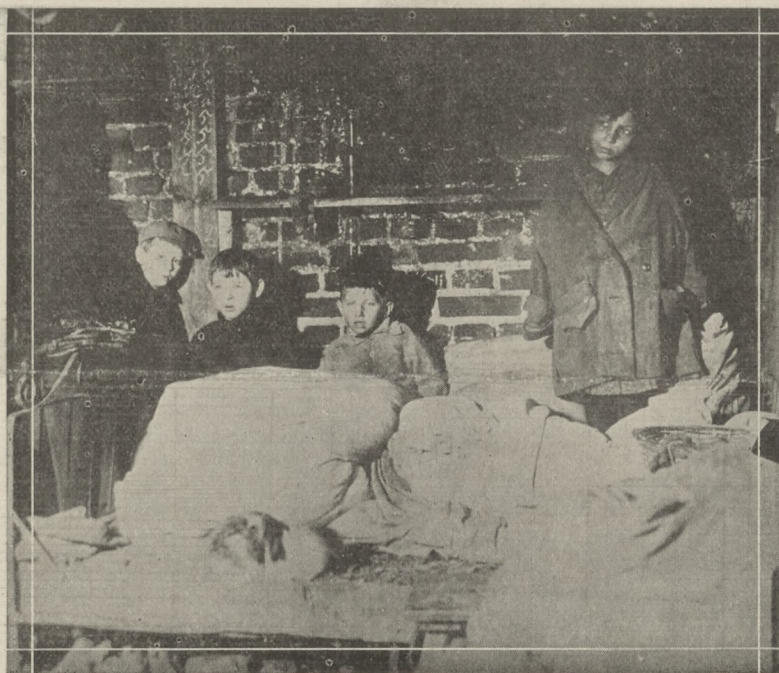

Enthusiasm Gathers Workers to Campaign Fund

Millions Pledged to United Jewish Campaign by Prominent Jews

With three million dollars, exactly half of New York City's \$6,000,000 quota in the United Jewish Campaign, raised in a single evening's giving every worker in the great drive army commanded by William Fox as chairman, is "hoofing it" on his own assigned task in the huge city-wide undertaking which is to roll up the second half of the big life-saving fund by May 9.

The scene was set by the three simultaneous dinners held last Sunday evening at the Biltmore and Astor Hotels to signalize the formal opening of the campaign, which brought together the most impressive gathering in the history of New York Jewry. Nearly 2,000 men and women, prominent leaders in every phase of communal and philanthropic activity, and making up a notable representation of every section and group in the Jewish life of the city, joined in making the triple launching an overwhelming affirmative response to the call for aid that has come from the millions of starving and despairing Jews, in the tragically stricken Jewish communities overseas.

The \$6,000,000 is to be raised in the five boroughs of this city, to be New York Jewry's share toward a national \$15,000,000 overseas chest for which local and sectional drives are now being conducted simultaneously in 45 states, under the nation chairmanship of David A. Brown of Detroit, who initiated the fund project immediately upon his return from a first-hand survey of Jewish conditions abroad last June.

The purpose of the overseas chest is to provide immediate relief and further reconstructive aid for the war-impooverished Jewish communities of Eastern Europe, now suffering a renewed crisis of want and destitution as a result of the latest economic collapse in Poland, Galicia, and Bessarabia, where two years of crop failures have added famine and epidemic to the distress of financial stringency, unemployment and commercial ruin.

Another object of the fund is to further the Jewish back-to-the-soil movement in Russia by which thousands of families of the old Pale of Settlement, deprived of their former livelihood as merchants and traders in the cities by the government ban on middlemen occupations, are seeking a new foothold as productive workers on the soil. Hundreds of thousands of fertile acres on the vast prairies of Russia have been opened up by the government to Jewish settlers, who have been enabled to make the transition into their new life by loans from the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

Foremost among the sponsors of both the national and the local movement are Louis Marshall, chairman of the American Jewish Relief Committee, and Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, who are the honorary chairmen of the New York organization. The other officers associated with Mr. Fox are David M. Bressler, vice-chairman in active charge, and Jonah J. Goldstein, also vice-chairman; Marcy I. Berger, secretary; Paul Baerwald, treasurer, and Col. H. A. Guinsburg, associate treasurer. The headquarters of the campaign are at the Hotel Biltmore.

The Women's Division, which has set itself a \$500,000 quota to be raised exclusively from contributions of women, is headed by Mrs. Jacob H. Schiff, as honorary chairman and Mrs. Abram I. Elkus, as active chairman. Mrs. Alfred E. Smith, wife of the Governor, and Mrs. James J. Walker, wife of New York's Mayor, have been named honorary chairmen to serve in association with Mrs. Schiff.
