# I. S. Talmud Torah Conducts Term Examinations With The Utilization of Modern Means

Twenty-one Classes Partake in Semi-Annual Tests that Precede Promotions

Examinations are usually considered as an abomination by students. This is true most everywhere, perhaps with the exception of the I. S. Talmud Torah. Here, the exams are so interesting, and what is still better, they are so short.

Last week twenty-one classes partook of the term quizzes, each class having a uniform examination varying in difficulty with each grade. In keeping with modern methods, the only kind ever utilized by the Talmud Torah, the newest type examinations were prepared—completion, the multiple choice and the plus and minus types. Rabbi Orally Examines

Rabbi Goldstein also examined several of the classes and was quite satisfied with the results. Besides Bible and Religion, there were tests conducted in Jewish History and Hebrew, the latter being in the conventional essay type.

Stress Uniform Tests

According to Mr. Datt, the principal, the I. S. Talmud Torah is one of the few schools that can boast of uniform examinations, which, incidentally, leads to better results. Although the Jewish Educational Association has been stressing the adoption of uniform tests, it is gradually being utilized.

# JEWS HAVE BEEN RESIDENTS OF CHINA FOR THE LAST TWO THOUSANDS YEARS

It is of noteworthy interest to learn that Jews have been living in China for more than two thousand years. They are known as Tiau Kiu Kiaou (the sect which extracts the sinews). Their ancestors, it is believed, originally came from Persia.

In the Middle Ages, these Jews exerted a very potent influence upon the Chinese Empire, both politically and financially, a fact referred to by Marco Polo in his book of "Travels." Due to internal dissension, repeated famines and plagues, but few of the descendants of the original stock remain to tell the tale. They are in wretched circumstances, but are being aided by modern Chinese Jews who have settled in the celestial republic following the World War.

#### DEATH TAKES JOSEPH GOLDBERG-ER, FAMOUS JEWISH DOCTOR,

Death, some two weeks ago, claimed Dr. Joseph Goldberger, one of humanity's greatest benefactors. Like all great men who devoted their lives to the betterment of mankind, he achieved outstanding success through heroic, ceaseless and tireless struggle. Among his many achievements the greatest, upon which rests his undying fame, was his battle and final conquest of the dread malady—pellagra.

In 1914, Dr. Goldberger became a member of the United States Medical Bureau. He was ordered South by the United States Government to assume full charge of investigations of pellagra, the then mysterious and baffling scourge which was ravaging the States of Mississippi, Georgia and South Carolina. At that time it was generally believed by the medical fraternity that pellagra was contagious and had its origin in the existence of germs.

Dr. Goldberger, in commencing his investigations, cast this theory aside. He found that the poor and not the rich became victims. Furthermore, he discovered that the doctors and nurses in contact with the victims remained unaffected. From these observations, he arrived at the conclusion that the plague was not contagious, or carried by a microbe, but merely by a diet which failed to include fresh meat or milk.

Dr. Goldberger, shortly thereafter, discovered that yeast included in the ordinary meatless and milkless diet, was entirely effective in preventing as well as curing the

ailment.

The Yeshivas have, therefore, sent delegations to this country to implore the Jews of America to help them at this critical juncture.

After consulting with our President, Congressman Isaac Siegel, we thought it advisable to issue one appeal for all the institutions. A committee will be appointed by the President to dis-

tribute the funds.

#### BLEASE BILL, FOR REGISTRATION OF ALIENS, OPPOSED BY JEWISH CONGRESSMEN

Proposed Legislation Would Lead to Inquisitorial Police Tactics and is Un-American

Once more do we find our "hundred-percenters" in Congress urging another restriction upon foriegn-born residents of this country. This time it is the Blease Bill for registration of aliens. Fortunately, the New York Congressmen, with Mr. Dickstein outstanding, are furnishing a strong opposition to the passage of this obnoxious bill.

#### A Wolf in Sheep's Clothing

Among the foremost objections to the Blease Bill are: that it violates some of the most fundamental principles of Americanism and that it is merely an entering wedge for compulsory registration. As the "Jewish Tribune" refers to it: "The Blease Bill is a wolf in sheep's clothing." It would mean, soon after its adoption, an inauguration of certificate inquisition, for which European countries are so notorious.

Would Require Registration Certificate
It would be a common sight to have police stop aliens on the street and ask for their registration certificates. It is the kind of infringement that would go gracefully with a Czaristic policy, but could hardly exist in liberty-loving America.

#### Third Degree?

We have more faith in Congress than to allow the passage of this bill, originated by a bigoted South Carolinian. Although in appearance it is quite innocent-looking, it requires no stretching of the imagination to see towards what undesirable results it might lead. Having residents put through a third degree by police officers searching for their identification cards is as undesirable as it is un-American.
