TALMUD TORAH TO BE CONDUCTED ON SUMMER SCHEDULE

It is interesting to know that the Talmud Torah classes will continue throughout the year—summer weather notwithstanding. Beginning with July 1st, the Talmud Torah will be in session Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings and will so continue throughout the summer months until the fall, when the regular program will again be instituted.

LIFE OF LOUIS BRANDEIS; HIS LIFE AND ADDRESSES To Be Published Soon

A considerable number of addresses originally delivered by Justice Louis D. Brandeis, in intimate or semi-private circles, have been collected and made part of a volume announced for immediate publication. One that is bound to create much interest is Justice Brandeis' own version of his "break" in 1920 with the present Zionist leader, Dr. Weizmann. This particular address is accompanied by a facsimile, in Lord Reading's handwriting, of his plan to organize the Palestine Development work on an economic basis. It was the advocacy of the project by the Justice which led to the rupture in Zionism, first in London and then in the United States.

As introduction to these addresses Jacob de Haas, whose "Theodor Herzl" made a deep impression a year ago, has written a fairly full length intimate sketch of Mr. Brandeis, covering in particular his association with Jewish and Zionist causes. It is not generally known that from 1914 to 1921 Mr. Brandeis was the "silent leader" of the movement to regain the historic rights of the Jews to Palestine. In these fields the author has been closely associated with Mr. Brandeis.

CONFERENCE OF JEWISH CENTER SECRETARIES AT ATLANTIC CITY

Evaluating the conference of the National Association of Jewish Community Center Secretaries, held at Atlantic City, N. J., June 5th to 7th, Harry L. Glucksman, executive director of the Jewish Welfare Board, traced the development of the movement and pointed out that from the very outset the Y. M. H. A. was organized in response to definite needs of Jewish life in America, particularly as they related to the youth.

In directing himself to the central thesis of the conference, namely the educational program of the Jewish Center, Mr. Glucksman emphasized the interrelation of educational objectives with the objectives of the Jewish Center as a whole. He urged the desirability of scientific evaluation of the program and suggested that such inquiries take into account the establishment of experiments in Centers in type communities where the problem of the Center in relation to the non-Jewish environment and its effect on the Center should be studied; where the reactions, attitudes, intuitions and feelings of those who come to the Center must be reviewed over an extended period of time.

Mr. Glucksman said that although the work with juniors should be emphasized, to exclude seniors or to minimize the value of work with them is to deny the implications of the adult educational movement. This involved re-education of the individual, in the carrying out of which the Jewish Center has an important and continuing responsibility in fulfilling its obligations to seniors and adults.

In discussing the educational program of the Jewish Center, Dr. Horace M. Kallen pointed out changing concepts in Jewish Center thought with its increasing emphasis upon Jewish values. He regarded the Center as having a unique opportunity in making for the permanence of Jewish group life in America. The Center's approach to Jewish youth is facilitated by its secular attitude. The problem before the Center, as well as other educational institutions, is to develop a program content that will serve as a basis for the promotion of Jewish consciousness.
