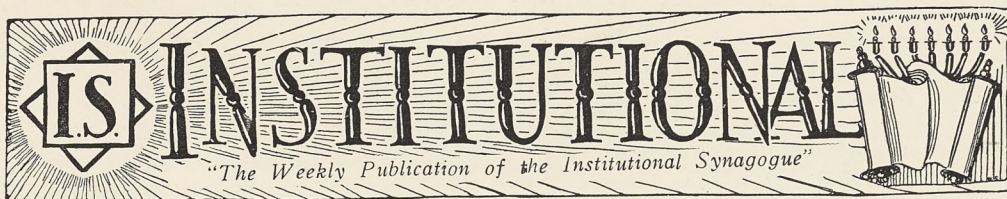

Under the auspices of the Dept. of Center Activities, a colorful and gala Musical Comedy and Revue will be presented on Saturday evening, December 26th, in the I. S. Auditorium. Dancing will follow in the Gym.

Mr. Bookbinder and his associates, the Misses Stoller, Taitz and Zausmer, and Messrs. Solly Alper and Joe Abrams, have arranged a series of unusual dance routines, songs, skits and all the colorful trappings of an excellent musical revue. A "pony" chorus has been rehearsing these past weeks. Excellent soloists and comedians will add a spicy dash to the program.

All seats are reserved. Early purchasers can secure the best seats if they make their reservations now. The seats in the first eight rows of the orchestra will be sold for one dollar each. The remainder of the orchestra and balcony seats will cost only fifty cents. It is planned that club parties can secure immediate reservations of the desired orchestra seats if they advise Mr. Charles Cohen at once. There will be a single admission for the Dance and Revue. In other words, a dance and revue both for the one price.

A large audience is anticipated. Many notables will be present. A gala carnival spirit, a colorful function, a spicy and peppy revue, a sure-fire musical comedy will assure all an memorable evening of fun and frivolity.
