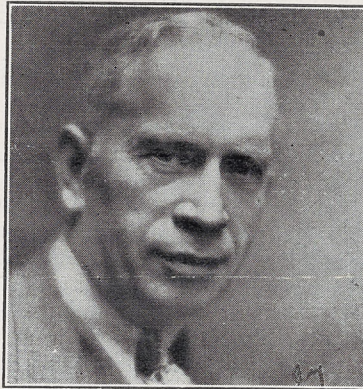

## POLISH REBIRTH

For both we bespeak,

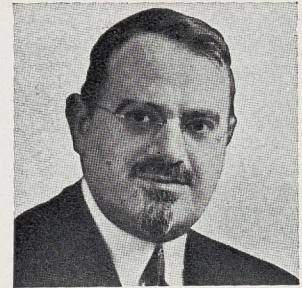

## CONSCIENCE

III

The Jew is the barometer of the world's conscience. Nations tortured by conscience drive out their Jews. In the words of Shakespeare, "Conscience doth make cowards of us all."

The Talmud tells us that Rabbi Eleazer wept when he read the verse, "And Joseph said unto his brethren I am Joseph, is father still alive? And his brethren could not answer him, they were troubled at his presence." For, said Rabbi Eleazer, if our conscience is so much troubled in the presence of man, how much more so will it be before the Holy One Blessed be He? The lesson of it all is that we should know, as a law of the Spiritual Life, that when we wrong someone by deed or by word of mouth, we shall have a troubled conscience. Let us, therefore, in view of life's experience, so live that we are masters of ourselves, and therefore captains of our fate.

This can be accomplished by true repentance; first by sincere regret for the past, which brings forgiveness, for as the Psalmist put it (Psalm 30) "For with Thee, there is forgiveness;" and second, as the Sage advises, by "Repenting one day before death." His disciples asked him "How does man know upon which day he will die?" He answered, "The more reason one should repent every day." Certainly, my friends, if we knew the day before death, we would spend it as a day of piety, of charity, of kindness, of faith and of good deeds. Therefore let us live every day as an exemplary day, so that life may be secure and happy, with a clear conscience with which to meet our fellow men and our God, here, and pray in the grand hereafter.

"Would I act in this way, the day before my death?" The proper answer to this question will so regulate our life that we will never have any pangs coming from a troubled conscience, but the peace of mind that emanates from a clear and undisturbed conscience.

**OUR BRETHREN THE WORLD OVER****Polish Relief:**

News reaching Paris last week detailed the urgent need of 2,000,000 Jews in Poland for bread and warm clothing. To intensify the plight of these derelicts, whose property and homes were hardest hit of all in war-ravaged Poland, the usual means of relief have either broken down or are being halted by the Nazis. The only Relief agency functioning at all is the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, which maintains relief centers and shelters in Warsaw and other large cities within the Nazi-dominated areas of Poland. In spite of all its good work, however, poverty and want are growing daily because of the influx into the large cities of homeless refugees from small, demolished Polish villages.

Only in Soviet-dominated Poland is there much hope of a fairly secure future for homeless refugees. According to a statement by Soviet officials in London, the thousands of Jewish refugees from Nazi Poland will be treated without discrimination as political refugees, which is taken to mean that the State assumes the responsibility of finding means of livelihood for the unfortunates.

**Ghetto Order:**

Over the protests of the Warsaw Jewish Community, German authorities are carrying on with the Gestapo's plans to confine all Warsaw Jews within a small area of the former Jewish-populated sections. According to some reports, Gestapo officials offered to rescind the order upon payment of a gigantic fine, but officials of the Jewish community rejected the offer in the belief that even if the money could be raised, payment would do no good.

**In Czechoslovakia:**

The latest blow to Jews in the Bohemia-Moravia protectorate is a decree that Jews may no longer derive income from their real estate holdings. Interest on mortgages, likewise, may no longer be paid unless the mortgage-holders are "Aryan."

The new decree, coupled with recent measures making it possible to discharge Jewish employees without the usual severance pay, is a further step in the direction of making it impossible for Czech Jews to make a living.

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**WANTED: A SINGLE STANDARD ON DICTATORSHIP**

A single standard in political morality is even more important than a single standard in sex morality, for deviation from the single standard code in private life affects individuals. The maintenance of a double standard of political morality has widespread communal effect and may even threaten our security and peace.

For some time now many liberals and progressives in this country have been functioning on a double standard of political opinion and activity on the question of dictatorship. They have been uniform in their condemnation of the Fascist and Nazi dictatorships. But some of them could not bring themselves to say anything untoward or do anything against the Communist dictatorship. By their silence they have lent moral standing to an immoral and inhuman tyranny.

Today when the principal totalitarian dictatorships, Germany and Russia, not content with their domestic powers of suppression, are actively co-operating to extend their sway over free peoples and institutions beyond their own borders, anyone who fails to raise his voice in condemnation of these and other totalitarian regimes, stamps himself a friend of dictatorship and an enemy of free government.

The honest progressive, the clear-thinking liberal, knows that despite the self-proclaimed holy mission of Communism, the dictatorships — red, as well as black and brown — are at one in their destruction of all the precious values and ideals of civilization. The honest progressive or liberal suffers no color blindness when confronted with the spectacle of tyranny. The suppression of free speech is tyranny, no matter what slogan is used to justify it. Suppression of religious freedom, of the free ballot, of free assembly, of the free choice of work and occupation are tyranny whether they are done under the red, black or brown banner.

No one can call himself a supporter of free institutions who is

### THE ONLY REFUGE

A million and a half of our co-religionists make up the Jewish refugee problem in war-torn Europe. And what a misnomer is the word 'refugee' when applied to our people! Refugee refers to one, who, having suffered tyranny and oppression, has fled and found a haven of peace, a refuge. The Jewish refugees abroad are still helpless social outcasts, human derelicts, adrift in an ocean of misery, without assurance of even an approximation of refuge.

If one asks, "What of the plight of Christian political refugees?" the answer is contained in the phrase, 'political refugee'.

What a world of difference there is between the Jewish and non-Jewish refugee. The non-Jewish refugee, some day, ultimately, when justice prevails, when his people is restored and his former government re-established, will of a certainty return to his land and fireside. While in exile, he lives with a positive hope and enjoys the kinship and spiritual affinity of fellow Christians, the only difference being language. Not so with the Jewish refugee. Even before the European calamity, the earth he trod with seeming security was never his own.

The great majority of Jewish refugees, sad to say, will remain unsalvaged human wrecks, fast declining to a poverty stricken level, homeless and unwanted people with no soil they may rightfully call their own.

The Evian Conference failed to find a solution to the problem. The more recent inter-governmental committee convening in Washington accomplished little. In all their deliberations and speeches, the far ends of the earth were suggested for Jewish re-settlement, but Palestine, the natural homeland of the Jew, was carefully ignored. Yet, Eretz Yisroel stands as the beacon of light, of faith and courage, ready and able to receive her weary sons from exile.

silent in the face of purges, blood baths and star-chamber trials when they occur in Russia, and yet cries out against them when they occur in Germany or Italy. No one can call himself a friend of minorities and of small nations who views as imperialism their destruction by Hitler and Mussolini but sees their destruction by Stalin as "self-protection" or "liberation."

In this critical hour when the forces of dictatorship and tyranny are united to crush the free governments of Europe, no liberal, progressive or democratic organization can tolerate color-blindness in respect to the dictatorships. Nor can it accept a double standard of political morality on the question of dictatorship, and remain true to its faith. They who maintain such a double standard cannot be trusted with the institutions of democracy. The defense of democracy and free government demands a single standard in politics.
