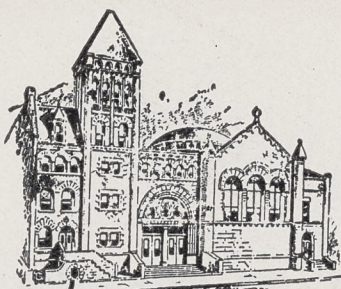

JEWISH STUDENTS

Mark Twain once said that everybody complains about the weather but no one does anything about it. A similar situation seems to exist with regard to the Jewish medical student, with a similar aura of futility.

When we were young, the Jewish boy who had the grades as well as the tuition, just went to any medical school he desired to enter and matriculated. That was the end of that. To-day, it is quite a different story.

First of all, the Jewish applicant must be far ahead of his non-Jewish competitor even to be considered. Secondly, he must come from the right side of the railroad tracks. Brownsville and the Bronx are a terrible handicap.

Then, there must be many important people who will vouch for him. And after all that happens, he is not admitted, though he tries one school after another, crossing state and even national boundary lines in his quest.

The reason is obvious. But what is to be done? We are happy to see that Mr. Max D. Steuer is devoting his great talents to an attempted solution of the difficulty. In an address over WMCA last Sunday, he repeated his charge that Jews were barred from medical schools and stated that plans were under way to establish a new school of medi-

cine, free from discrimination.

We wish Mr. Steuer success in this undertaking and promise our fullest co-operation. We urge our readers to join in this movement with enthusiasm.

YELLOW BADGE

"Kultural" Germany, with a biological reversion to "Middle Ages" type, has decreed that the Jews of Poland must be packed into a ghetto surrounded with barbed wire, whence they may emerge only during daylight hours, and that each must wear a yellow arm-band.

The victims will obey, for life is very dear and the oppressor is merciless.

The point we wish to make, however, though we expect condemnation for our pains, is that this badge of shame shall not, through the passage of time, become so associated with our customs as to make some, whose ideas of religious observances become very much confused, deem the yellow badge part of a Jew's necessary outfit.

For example, in the Fifteenth Century, Spain and other nations that followed her leadership decreed that the Jews wear long, clumsy coats. The Spanish word for coat is "capote."

After many years, the Jews became so accustomed to the long coat that it became associated, in the minds of those who think Judaism is more a matter of form than spirit, with religious custom. That explains why, on frequent occasions, we are treated to the startling view of our recently arrived co-religionists, in an outfit that, to say the least, makes one rub his eyes and ask if he is seeing things. Little do they realize that they are perpetuating the badge of shame instigated by the unspeakable Torquemada, the precursor of the modern Hitler.

COMMANDMENT NUMBER ONE AND BIRTH CONTROL

It has often been stated that the mother who bears many children loses her health. There are statistics to prove that maternal longevity is associated with large families. Not the bearing of children, but ignorance and the lack of medical care have in most cases been the real causes of disease and death. A physician of standing wrote in one of the British Medical Reviews as follows: "An experience of well over forty years convinces me that the artificial limitation of the family causes damage to a woman's nervous system. It makes her not only sterile, but also nervous, and generally poor in health." Fibroids and neuroses of various kinds are traceable, according to the testimony of leading physicians, to birth control.

I have found that birth control is largely responsible for the breakdown of the stability of the marriage bond. And one-room hotel suites or expensive two-room apartments occupied by tens of thousands of married people are evidences of a preconceived determination on the part of the so-called better classes for birth control. As a result, there is no real home life and a total lack of the joy and rejuvenation of spirit that children bring into a home.

It has been stated that a large family brings its attendant blessings unto the children therein. A large family brings in its train self-reliance, generosity and responsibility. On the other hand, the one or two children of the modern home are generally petted, self-opinionated, and selfish. Furthermore, statistics prove that the third, fourth, or fifth child is apt to be the best; for the first or second is most liable "to inherit some of the most outstanding physical and mental defects of the parents."

Judaism does not descend to the low levels of men and women; it lifts them up from these low levels and pronounces the commandment as a blessing: "Be fruitful and multiply."

OUR BRETHREN THE WORLD OVER

Reports, at first hand, of conditions within Nazi Poland were received recently from Dr. Henry Szoskies, escaped former leader of the Hebrew religious community in Warsaw.

According to Dr. Szoskies, Jews all over the conquered area are living in constant fear of new persecutions. He told of the rapid carrying out of the Gestapo's order to establish a ghetto in Warsaw, in spite of the mounting toll of typhoid and dysentery epidemics. The plight of Polish tradesmen, forced out of their businesses by the confiscating orders of the Gestapo, and the introduction of yellow badges for Jews in many parts of the country were also cited.

It was decreed last week that all Jews are to leave the former Free City of Danzig by December 31 of this year.

A protest against the Jewish "reservation" in the Lublin district of Poland was issued last week by the executive committee of the world Jewish Congress, meeting in Paris. Jews in the area, it was alleged, are being exposed to starvation and inhuman treatment.

Postmaster General Farley, speaking to a Washington Heights group who had gathered to discuss anti-Semitic outbreaks in their community, evinced firm faith that persecution of Jews and other minorities will never be a serious problem in this country. Other speakers at the meeting, which lasted from 7 P.M. one night until the early hours of the next morning, many of them representatives of the Catholic Church, all scored as un-Christian those Catholics who, along with Father Coughlin, are indulging in anti-Semitic propaganda.

THE HOME OF THE DAUGHTERS OF ISRAEL



HOME OF THE DAUGHTERS OF ISRAEL, 1260 Fifth Avenue

This year, as it celebrates the 30th anniversary of its founding, the Home of the Daughters of Israel looks back on a career that represents a dream come true. The dream was that of Mrs. Sarah Michaelson, who, in May, 1907, joined with five other women to discuss ways and means of providing a home for old people. With an initial fund of only \$25 and a large room in a private house, an outstanding benevolent institution was launched.

Spurred on by increased demands of aged men and women for a haven, the valiant group of women, after gradually enlarging the original establishment, began to build plans for a future Home of the Daughters of Israel that would be able to care for hundreds of aged people in their time of greatest want. Thanks to their initial efforts and to the support of many men and women who joined the ranks at that time, the present building, a beautiful, modern, eight-story structure on Fifth Avenue at 107th Street, was erected.

The home today has accommodations for over 400 men and women. An entire floor is built as a hospital, with the most modern equipment and a skilled Medical Board to take care of all the needs of human be-

ings on whom have descended the triangle of human afflictions, poverty, ill health and old age.

The Home of the Daughters of Israel has brought not only succor, but comfort and happiness to the aged and indigent. A wealth of activities keeps the hands and minds of the aged inmates occupied. Scholarly interests are fostered by Chevra Mishna'is and Ain Yankov groups. In an Occupational Therapy group, a competent instructor guides old hands in the arts of knitting, crocheting, mending and weaving.

In order to establish a cozy, home-like atmosphere, especially for the newcomers, a Reception Committee has been created. This is only one of the aspects of the kindness and friendliness that permeate the entire institution. A Social Service Department has recently been installed.

Under the able leadership of the President, Mr. Jacob Siegel, the Home of the Daughters of Israel has been able to perform its benevolent offices unstintingly, and yet operate without a deficit; truly a dream come true.

JEWISH LEARNING

By RABBI EMANUEL L. LIFSCHITZ

If Judaism is to survive in this modern age, then it is vitally necessary to maintain a high level of Jewish learning and culture as implied in the broader connotations of the term Torah. Throughout the long history of Jewish wandering it was the Torah, its study and adherence that preserved Judaism. It was the Torah that inspired and gave courage to the Jew to carry on despite the darkness of the age in which he lived and despite the suffering which he endured. It was the Torah that moved the Jew to die at the stake, to leap into the fires of fury uttering the "Shema". For in the Torah he discovered a dynamic, all-embracing purpose in life.

In the older European generation it was not merely individuals, but rather the Jewish community as a group that was learned in the Torah. There are instances too numerous to mention in which laymen equalled the Rabbis in Talmudic and Halachik (legal) learning. The only difference being that the Rabbi was officially ordained. He was the recognized religious authority and leader in the community, who devoted his full time to the cultural and spiritual needs of his people.

In the erstwhile Kehiloth of Wilna, Warsaw and Bialistok, to mention but a few cities distinguished by their learning, there obtained no Jewish illiteracy. If one were not a scholar of the Talmud, he at least enjoyed a thorough knowledge of the Bible and Jewish History. An Am Hooretz (ignorant person) was one one who was familiar with the Hebrew prayer book, knew his Psalms, could use a Biblical or Talmudic phrase in ordinary conversation.

Alas, in our day the slightest degree of learning that goes beyond the unintelligible reading of the prayer book is limited to the Yeshivoth Ktonoth (elementary Yeshivoth) while all advanced Jewish scholarship is limited to either Rabbinical schools or teachers' training schools.
